

SP Is Ordering New Equipment

Southern Pacific's postwar orders for streamlined, lightweight passenger equipment, including all units of the Shasta Daylights for the Portland-San Francisco run, now total 52 cars and five powerful Diesel-electric locomotives, it was announced Saturday by J. A.

Ormandy, general passenger agent at Portland. It is expected the new equipment will be delivered so that the Shasta Daylights can go into operation in the late spring of next year, depending on the ability of the manufacturers to make deliveries. The Shasta Daylights will leave Portland and San Francisco in the morning and arrive at the opposite terminals in the late evening of the same day. SP representatives in Eugene said no schedules have been set for the trains.

With general design of the new cars now definitely established, Ormandy pointed out that a distinctive feature of the Shasta Daylight will be the spacious windows of extra height to give travelers greater view of scenic attractions. Also included will be reclining, rotating seats with foam-rubber cushions, fluorescent lighting, electric water coolers, electric elevators for ease in handling luggage, rich fabrics and modernistic interior tints, and a new recorder device to improve broadcasting of music when radio reception is poor.

650 Learning How to Swim

The county Red Cross swim campaign is in full swing in many communities in Lane County, reports Miss Margaret Brewster, director of the campaign this summer.

Programs that will be active as of Monday, July 22, include those in Blue River, Cottage Grove, Mapleton-Swisshome, Florence, Triangle Lake-Bischly, Junction City and Eugene. Conducting the classes are Red Cross water safety instructors, Barbara Bozorth, Heneel Huestis, Harriet Monet, Ruth Robertson, Ralph Huestis, and Miss Brewster.

Total enrollment of the campaign to date is 650 children, Miss Brewster said, the largest enrollment for the county in more than five years. In Cottage Grove, where 100 are enrolled, 80 are beginners. All but a few of these children have learned to swim after two weeks of instruction. The program will run one more week there.

Registration for the Springfield campaign, which will be held July 29 to August 17 at the men's pool on the campus, and for another from August 6 to 31 at the Anchorage, is now in progress. Walter Hansen, director of Springfield playgrounds, said that registration cards are being distributed, and may be obtained at any Springfield playground.

Eugene children may register for another campaign to be held July 29 to August 17 at the men's pool at the Red Cross office in Eugene. Registration dates for this campaign will be July 28 and 27.

Any child interested may register for the free instruction.

County Receives Fund From Secretary of State

Mrs. Grace Schiska, Lane County treasurer, announced Saturday that the county received \$1,661.43 as the county's share of the "manufacturers and importers" tax, from the secretary of state's office.

The county, as designated by the state law, receives 75 per cent of these funds, which are distributed on a population basis and earmarked by the state for aid to mothers, old age benefits and direct relief.

Marine Enlistees Get Benefits of GI Bill

Men in the 17 to 25 age group eligible to enlist in the Marine Corps will receive full benefits of the GI Bill of Rights, hospitalization, dental care, food and clothing, in addition to travel and education privileges, local Marine Corps recruiters point out. Enlistments may be made for two, three, or four-year periods, and beginning pay is \$75 a month.

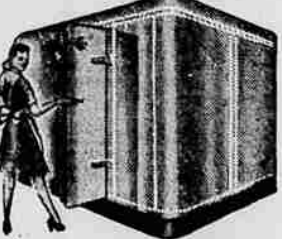
High school graduates are eligible for 36 months of college training at government expense on completion of a two-year enlistment, and 48 months if they enlist for three years' time. Further information on Marine Corps opportunities may be obtained at the Marine Recruiting Station, Room 207, Eugene Armory, Seventh Ave. and Oak St. Marine Corps strength now is limited to 100,000.

500 Poles Arrested In Pogrom Investigation

WARSAW—(AP)—An authoritative source said Saturday a total of 500 shopkeepers, artisans and others had been arrested in the government's investigation of the Kielce pogrom of July 4.

This informant said a special military court was expected to try about 40 militiamen in connection with the incident, in which 41 persons, mostly Jews, were killed. Nine men convicted of taking part in the pogrom were executed last Sunday.
