

Fescue Grasses Prove Good Coast Forage Crop in Tests

Fescue grasses have proven highly satisfactory as forage crops in nursery tests conducted on the coastal areas of Lane County, O. S. Fletcher, county agent, announced Monday.

The announcement was made after Fletcher, Assistant County Agent W. B. Parker and H. A. Schoth, U. S. Department of Agriculture forage crop specialist at Oregon State College, returned from field meetings at the forage nurseries. The meetings, which

were attended by a group of Lane County farmers, were arranged by the county agent's office in cooperation with the agriculture committees of western Lane Granges.

Fletcher and Schoth discussed the suitability of the various varieties of crops and cultural practices and fertilizers with the group.

Alta Fescue, Chewings Fescue and Creeping Red Fescue stood heavy pasturing well and maintained good stands in all cases, Fletcher said. The two mid-season varieties of subterranean clover in the Albert Harins nursery

Fletcher said, although poor stands were obtained on some of the other nurseries.

On the William Scott farm a plot has been planted to Alta Fescue and three varieties of lotus, Fletcher said. All the plot was seeded to Alta Fescue, while one third was seeded to hairy-type lotus major, another third to smooth-type lotus major, and the remainder to lotus corniculatus. A good stand was obtained throughout the plot, Fletcher said, but the smooth type lotus major is most promising.

Among the varieties which were found to be unsatisfactory either because they failed to produce a good stand or because they would not maintain the stand when heavily pastured, were Meadow Oat Grass, Superior Reed Canary Grass, English Ryegrass, early and late varieties of subterranean clovers, California bur clover and Southern Bur Clover.

OPA Resumes Rent Hearings

The Eugene OPA Rent Control Office has resumed handling compliance conferences with landlords and tenants and interviews for alleged violations occurring before July 1, Rupert K. Shaw, area representative, announced Tuesday. These usual notices are being sent to landlords and tenants, he said.

This action is taken, Shaw explained, on instructions from the National OPA Rent Office, so that the backlog of such cases may be cleared up in the event Federal Rent Control again becomes effective. At that time, an influx of new complaints is naturally anticipated, he added.

The Eugene office has a large number of cases on hand which will require compliance meetings with landlords or tenants, Shaw said, involving violations prior to July 1. These will be processed and brought to completion in the usual manner with refunds made to tenants for proved violations of overcharges made before OPA was terminated.

Shortage of Skilled Building Labor Seen

PORTLAND — (AP) — Materials shortages for home building are easing rapidly, but the industry soon will face a more critical skilled labor shortage, a National Housing Agency specialist told the Portland Mayor's Committee on Veterans' Housing.

Frank Bacon, materials and labor agent from the Seattle NHA office, said new labor must be drawn from the apprentice field and urged a campaign to encourage veterans to apply for apprenticeships.

Bacon warned the construction industry has not drawn sufficient apprentice applicants and soon will feel the crippling effects of the shortage.

Search Parties Scour Mountain for Youth

NORTH BEND, Wash. — (AP) — Three search parties Tuesday continued to comb the bleak recesses of Granite Mountain in the Cascades for Ernest C. Hasreiter, 24-year-old Seattle college student, missing since Sunday while on a hiking expedition.

District Assistant Forest Ranger Henry A. Hansmeier said one group of searchers had found barefoot tracks in the snow on the east side of the mountain but that the tracks ended at the shore of Granite Lake.

Hansmeier said the youth apparently was wandering in the forested area clad only in a pair of shorts as his trousers, socks, shoes and undershirt were found high up on the mountain.

'Fastest Major' Title to Be Settled

WASHINGTON, July 22 — (AP) — A purse of \$1,000 and the title of "fastest man in major league baseball" were plunked down today as prizes for a race between George Case of the Cleveland Indians and Gil Coan, Washington speed king.

The cash money was put up by club presidents Bill Veeck of Cleveland and Clark Griffith of Washington, after an argument arose over the relative speed of Case, the American League's leading base stealer, and Rookie Noan.

The two outfielders will whisk over a special course at Griffith Stadium August 21, preceding a night game.
