

approximately 80,000 ground troops and 8500 airmen would be authorized for units in the Sixth Army area.

Maj. Gen. Butler B. Miltonberger, after declaring that the Pacific Coast defense system may well "go 2000 to 3000 miles seaward" and include rockets and flying missiles, cited the following apportionments of guard strength:

Washington — 12,000 ground troops and 700 airmen; Oregon — 11,000 ground and 1100 air as well as basing elements of California's 40th Infantry Division; Idaho 3600 ground and 350 air; Montana 3700 ground and 350 air.

The 41st Division will be stationed in Washington, Oregon and Idaho with California and Oregon getting the 50th armored.

## Reds Identified As Captors

TIENTSIN, China.—(AP)—Seven U. S. Marines who were captured July 13 by some 80 armed Chinese Communists were released Wednesday night to a special executive headquarters truce team, the Marine commandant announced here. They were unharmed.

The Marines were seized by the Chinese at a small village 22 miles southwest of the port of Chinwangtao, where they had gone to obtain ice.

Marine headquarters for the first time described the captors as Communists.

The Marines were identified as Sgt. John J. Herndon, Pfc. William O. Wick, Pfc. A. Sullivan, Pfc. Robert P. Wright, Jr., Pfc. Wallace R. Maisei, Pvt. James W. Shipley and Pvt. Arthur Maldonado. Home addresses were not given.

They were turned over to the truce team at Ninging, about 50 miles southwest of Chinwangtao, and were returned to their base Thursday.

Search by land, sea and air was conducted for six days after the Marines were seized. The hunt was called off to permit the truce team to negotiate with the Communists.

Marine headquarters offered no explanation of the incident. High Marine officers previously expressed the theory the Communists seized the men in an effort to make the Marines "lose face" in China.

## Cause of Walla Walla \$150,000 Fire Sought

WALLA WALLA, Wash.—(AP)—City officials probed ruins in a half-block downtown area Thursday searching for cause of a spectacular \$150,000 oil and paint fire which destroyed four buildings and damaged others.

The blaze broke out in the night, sweeping through the Tausick and Kauffman Fuel Co. garage and shop, burning the Zellerbach Paper Co. offices and warehouse and damaging the W. P. Fuller Paint Co. warehouse.

Firemen, employing all available city equipment, plus that from a nearby Army airfield, McCaw Hospital and a veterans' hospital, were hampered by continued explosion of oil and paint drums.

One spectator was overcome by smoke and heat.
