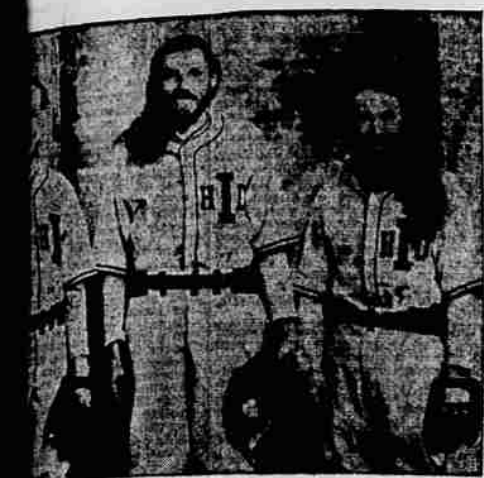

Bevos Take 4th From Oakland

(Associated Press) The baseball lesson today for San Francisco's and Oakland's blowhards for the Pacific Coast League pennant taught humility.

"Star of the pupils was pitcher Hy Vandenberg of the Oakland A's, who has bemoaned the fate that cast him in a Triple A league after his World Series hurling for the Chicago Cubs last year.

Sacramento's fifth-ranking Solons humbled the suddenly helpless San Francisco Seals 13-2 last night. Portland's seventh-place Beavers punished the A's 4-4 and boosted their current series advantage to four games to one.

Manager Casey Stengel hustled Vandenberg to the mound after Acorn starter Cotton Phippen had been blown out of the game in the fourth inning and let the former major leaguer suffer what came the rest of the way.

What came in the remaining five and one-third innings totaled 13 hits, including four home runs, for nine earned runs. Concession from the Beaver bats included Herman Reichs two-run homer in the fifth, Mayo Smith's bases-loaded circuit clot in the seventh, and consecutive poppers over the fence by Harvey Storey and George Vico in the eighth.

Portland held a 5-2 edge when Phippen retired, and so he was charged with the defeat. The Beavers blasted 21 hits off both hurlers.

Big Cliff Melton was the mound victim of San Francisco's worst defeat of the year. The Solons in a wild spree which retired him got eight tallies in the fourth inning. Jerry Staley allowed the Seals seven safeties, while Sacramento collected 11. Eugene Lumber Golfers Tops; Hoak, Chalfan, Terrell Tied

The Eugene Wholesalers, paced by co-medalist Jim Hoak, captured their fourth team championship in the fifth annual Willamette Valley Lumbermen's Golf Association tournament staged at the Eugene Country Club course Friday afternoon. Approximately 150 golfers from such distance points as Chicago, San Diego and Seattle braved steady rains to compete in the 18-hole handicap event.

Hoak, playing in his first WVLGA event since the 1943 inaugural when he annexed medalist honors, was forced to share low gross honors with two others, including Earl Chalfan, No. 1 man for the second-place Eugene Manufacturers' quartet and defending individual champion, and Harry Terrell, Jr., of Medford. All posted 73's, one over par.

Aiding Hoak's 73 for the champion Wholesalers were Jack Keri with a 74, who was runner-up medalist; Forrest Lemley and John Koike, both with 79's for a team aggregate of 305. The Manufacturers trailed by six strokes. Besides Chalfan's 73, members of the runner-up team were Bob Arkley, 1943 individual winner who fired a 75; Clarence Miller, with an 80, and Grover Kelsey, with an 82. The team total was 311. Portland, Medford and Roseburg teams also competed for the four-man squad honors.

Low net honors for individuals were captured by Huse Walters of Lebanon with a 66, followed by John Vosmik of Portland and Arkley, with 67's.

Longest-driving competition went to Jack Brande of Lebanon and Bob Anet of Eugene. Closest to the pin prizes were copped by Bill Coale, Jr., of Chicago, R. M. Moody of Lebanon and Charles Herman Ditewig of Eugene.

Awards for other golfing feats were presented to many of the other lumbering divoters at an open-air gathering following a buffet supper. Master of ceremonies was Leith Abbott, well-known Portland radio man, assisted by Chalfan who was general chairman for the event.
