

## Recipe

For salad dressings which require no hard-to-get salad oil, these are recommended for home preparation:

**Quick Sour Cream Dressing**  
1 cup sour cream  
2 tablespoons vinegar  
1 tablespoon pure New Orleans molasses  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
2 tablespoons sugar  
Dash of paprika

Beat cream, vinegar, molasses, and seasoning together until ingredients are well combined. Serve with vegetable salads.

**Hot Salad Dressing**  
2 teaspoons sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt

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1/2 teaspoon mustard  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1 cup vinegar  
1 tablespoon pure New Orleans molasses  
1/4 cup water  
1 tablespoon butter  
1 teaspoon flour  
1 egg, well beaten

Mix first four ingredients, stir in vinegar, molasses, and water. Boil all together. Rub butter and flour to a cream and add to the boiling mixture. Cook five minutes and then pour gradually over well-beaten egg. Mix while hot with cabbage or potatoes.

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## Book Review

"THIS AMAZING PLANET" by Roy Chapman Andrews, Putnam's Sons, N.Y., \$2.

This is a collection of eighty short stories, each with a few exceptions, covering about two pages. They were written by Andrews says, at the request of Mrs. William Brown Meloney, editor of This Week's Magazine, and began appearing in 1937. The first story, "The Valhalla of the Johnny Penguins," is a strangely moving romantic tale told by Dr. Robert Chasman Murphy, curator of oceanic birds in the American Museum of Natural History at South Georgia Island in the Sub-Arctic.

Dr. Murphy had wondered often that he had never come across the dead body of any full-grown Johnny Penguin. One day, however, he found a little transparent lake formed of snow water, some sickly looking little penguins standing around it, drooping and silent, seemingly exhausted by their climb. "The air seemed oppressed with tragedy," Dr. Brown felt as he walked to the rim of the pool and looked into its translucent depths.

On the cold blue bottom were myriads of dead Johnny penguins, flippers outstretched, that had climbed the long hill for escape from their enemies and had come to their last rest.

It seems that when love-making-time comes for penguins and Johnny is ready to propose, "he selects a pebble and lays it at his sweetheart's feet with pride and affection." If she picks it up, they are engaged; if not, he seeks farther. "One old Johnny waddled up to Dr. Murphy, the curator, and laid at his feet the shiny top of

a condensed milk can. The curator picked it up, bowed deeply to the penguin and they parted with mutual expressions of respect and esteem."

There is a dodo in the Museum—extinct for two centuries but reconstructed. Dr. Andrews says he has never seen a visitor stop in front of the case without laughing. The dodo was discovered in 1598 by a Dutch exploring party. He became extinct in 1700. A specimen was sent to Oxford but was not recognized by the Museum authorities. "In 1907 we exchanged the skeleton of a flightless dodo."
