Red Cross Aided Many Servicemen

"While the program of American Red Cross assistance to the servicemen, as well as to the veteran, is well known, not so much is known about the organization's program for servicemen and the woman veteran," Mrs. Cora I. Pirtle, executive secretary of the Lane County chapter, said this week.

Revealing that 76,047 servicemen were assisted by the Red Cross during 1945, she said that while the 1946 figure would be smaller, the program of assisting servicemen and women veterans is one in which most Red Cross chapters will be involved for many months to come.

Chapters gave assistance to 11,084 servicemen with personal and family problems in 1945, investigated the need for furloughs in 23,707 cases, and gave assistance in filing claims for disability benefits at time of discharge to 14,418 women of the Wacs, Waves, Spars and Women Marines.

"Although congressional approval to permit retention of servicemen in peacetime service has not been given, the American Red Cross is placing special emphasis on maintaining service to servicemen and on the continued development of its services to servicemen for whatever period they remain on duty," Mrs. Pirtle said.

Recipe

RAINBOW SPONGE
1 tablespoon gelatin
1/4 cup cold water
1 cup sugar
1 cup boiling water
3 egg whites
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1-8 teaspoon almond extract
Green food color
4 tablespoons nutmegs
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
4 marshmallows
1/4 cup raspberry juice
Few drops lemon juice
Pink food color
Whipped cream
Soak gelatin in cold water. Place sugar and boiling water in saucepan and boil three minutes, add gelatin and cool until it begins to set. Beat egg whites stiff. Beat gelatin mixture until light, add egg whites and beat until mixture holds shape. Divide in three parts. To one portion add vanilla, almond extract and green food color and
