

17 Million Earmarked for Use On Oregon River Projects

SALEM — The federal government will pour \$17,037,537 into the state of Oregon for flood control, reclamation and hydroelectric projects during the ensuing fiscal year, the Oregon Post-war Readjustment and Development Commission said Thursday.

The series of multiple-purpose dams in the Willamette Valley alone will receive \$7,745,000 and \$3,500,000 will go into relocation of the road to Detroit Dam site, McNary Dam on the Columbia

River is to receive \$2,500,000 this fiscal year, and reclamation projects are marked down for \$3,436,837 in federal moneys in this year's budget.

For each of the three dams to be constructed in the Willamette Valley, \$1,000,000 will be needed for labor villages which will contain larger populations than many incorporated cities already established in the state.

Actual work on the three dams — Dorena, Detroit and Meridian — has been started and other funds are assigned to conduct studies of proposed dam sites in other locations.

Dorena Dam, located in Lane County on Row River, has been allocated \$2,818,200 for the fiscal year, a little more than half the amount that will be required to complete the project.

Cost of the Detroit Dam on the North Santiam River is estimated at \$20,422,000, but is expected to be more. For the fiscal year the Army engineers will have \$3,400,000 to work with for this project. Meridian Dam in Lane County on the Middle Fork of the Wil-

lamette River, is estimated to cost \$21,518,000 and there is \$1,745,500 for the fiscal year.

Supplementing the two completed dams, Cottage Grove and Fern Ridge, and three in process the Army engineers plan to put \$525,500 into bank protection for the Willamette River. This work also will be undertaken within the year.

Money appropriated for the McNary Dam will be used for planning, purchasing the site and construction of a workers' camp.

Benton-Lane Park Sold to Seattle People

The Benton-Lane Park, five miles north of Junction City, has been sold to Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Boger of Seattle. The park has been owned and operated since 1926 by Mr. and Mrs. L. W. Mallory. It consists of a swimming pool, children's playground, dancing pavilion and baseball grounds. The Bogers will continue to operate the recreational area as has been done in the past.

\$140,000 Additional For Soil Conservation

PORTLAND — The department of Agriculture Production and Marketing Administration has announced that an additional \$140,000 will be available for Oregon soil and water conservation work in 1946.

This brings to \$2,853,650 federal funds to be paid Oregon farmers for land improvement practices.

She signed up for a "refresher course" including a history of the cultural development of the United States to 1860.

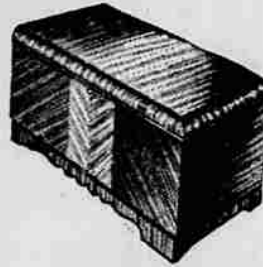
She took that course, she told school officials, because she pretty well remembers the history of the country since the Civil War.

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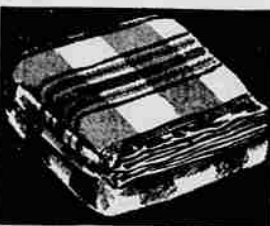

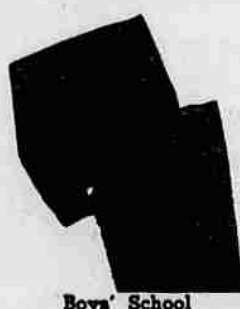
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
