Veterans May Sign For Farming Course

Openings in "on-the-farm" classes are still available to veterans in this area, it was reported Monday by E. A. Britton, supervisor of the program here.

Classes are now being held Thursdays from 8 to 10 p. m. in the Smith-Hughes department rooms at Eugene High School, Britton said, with a change forthcoming to twice-weekly classes Nov. 1, when the group will meet on Monday and Thursday from 10:20 to 12:20 a. m. Cloyd Makinson is in charge of classes.

Junction City will offer weekly classes Tuesdays from 7:30 to 10:30 p. m., Britton said. Britton will visit individual farms also, he said Monday, if veterans so desire. Veterans signed up for the program may receive subsistence payments, Britton said, if a minimum class attendance of 200 hours per year is achieved. Movies and still pictures, field trips, and meetings at Oregon State College will make up portions of class time, Britton added.

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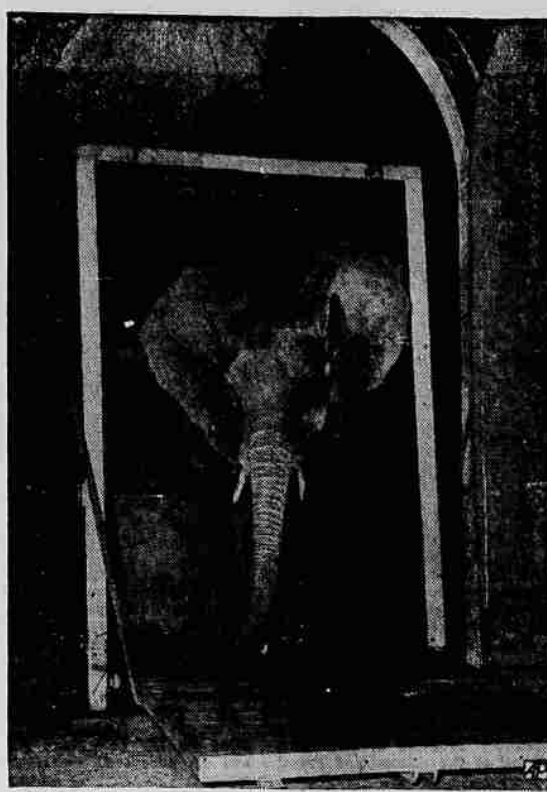

Big Fall Creek Area Produces High Amount of Scarce Lumber

The total volume of timber removed from the Big Fall Creek area in the Willamette National Forest, beginning 32 miles east of Eugene, recently exceeded 100 million board feet, it was announced Tuesday by J. R. Bruckart, Willamette Forest supervisor.

This drainage area was opened up in 1943 by the construction of a timber access road by the U. S. Forest Service. The Fall Creek area provided a source of badly needed timber supplies during the war and is presently contributing to log production for the emergency housing program, Bruckart stated.

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Hospital Gets Alteration Right

The Eugene Hospital & Clinic application to make \$18,000 worth of alterations was approved Monday by the Civilian Production Administration in Portland. At the same time the CPA denied the \$28,000 remodeling application of J. J. Chiaramonte for his Del Rey Cafe.

Eugene Hospital & Clinic alterations will include expanding and remodeling of the pharmacy and provision of more room for the doctors' offices. One new doctor has had no office of his own since he arrived two months ago. The office remodeling will cut down on hospital space somewhat, but will enlarge clinic facilities, according to Arthur Anderson, hospital manager.

The Washington, D. C., office of CPA rejected two Eugene appeals. One, by the Eugene Oil Co-op, would have spent \$18,000 for construction of a warehouse for farm machinery and miscellaneous farm supplies at Seventh Ave. and Fillmore St. The other was V. M. Bigham's request to spend \$8500 on a store.
