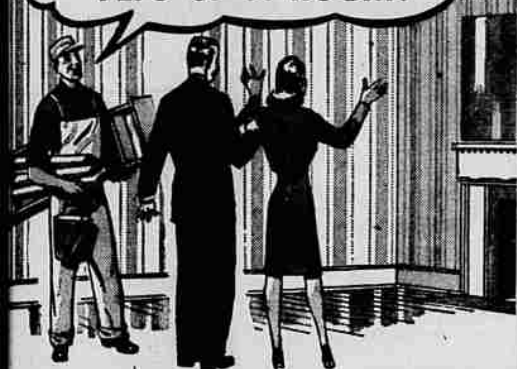

Landowners Get Ballots for Vote

Absentee ballots will be mailed
this week to over 80 landowners
in Lane County who are eligible
to vote in the referendum on the
proposed Linn-Lane Soil Conser-
vation District, it was reported
Tuesday by O. S. Fletcher, Lane
County agent.

Fletcher and William Parker,
assistant county agent, attended
a meeting at Harrisburg Monday
night of farmers interested in pro-
moting the soil conservation dis-
trict. A total of 35 farmers from
Linn and Lane counties was pres-
ent.

Review Lists

lots. Lane farmers worked with
Fletcher and Parker at the meet-
ing; Linn farmers with O. E. Mik-
sell, Linn County agent.

group the work of a soil conser-
vation district and procedures for
increasing the voter total.

Completed ballots are to be sent
to Hubert Willoughby, Rt. 1, Har-
r

burg, with a prompt return
urgued. Voting day and the dead-
line for returning of absentee
ballots is Nov. 15, Fletcher said.
The district as proposed would
take in the "prairie land" of Lane
County, Fletcher said, and would
extend as far north as Halsey and
east to Brownsville.
