Young G. O. P.'s Hit Pension Bill

The forthcoming election was discussed and plans made for campaigning for the party ticket at a meeting of the Young Republicans held this week in the Eugene Hotel.

The following resolution was adopted in opposition to the "Little Townsend Plan":

"Whereas the Lane County Young Republican Club, after analysis of the proposed 3 per cent gross income tax bill, finds such legislation to be unsound economically, conducive to waste and a delusion to our senior citizens to whom it offers no guarantee of protection, with greatly increased costs of living for all, containing the combined evils of sales tax and of income taxes, with none of the modifications normally used to balance either and,

"Whereas benefits to our senior citizens have been doubled in the last four years under the existing state administration without resort to dangerous tax practices,

"It is hereby resolved that the Lane County Young Republican Club publicly urges the people of Oregon to vote 15 X No at the general election, Nov. 5, 1946."

Secretary of State Robert Farrell met the group and gave a brief address.

Also announced was the formation of a Snell for Governor Committee in the county with the following officers: Lewis Hoffman, general chairman; G. E. Gaylord, publicity chairman; Mrs. Lillian A. U S to Reject Plan For Supporting UN

FLUSHING, N. Y. — (U.P.) — The United States delegation has a firm but polite "no" ready when the United Nations General Assembly's committee of experts submits its proposal that the U. S. pay at least 49 per cent of the U. N.'s operating expenses, it was learned Thursday.

An authoritative source told the United Press that instead the U. S. delegation will make a counter-proposal calling for the establishment of a flat ceiling for contributions as well as a set minimum. The present disposition is to ask for a top maximum contribution of 25 per cent.

On the 49 per cent basis, the United States would not be paying a large amount of money relative to speaking. This year's UN budget is about \$21,000,000. Next year the budget is expected to be about \$25,000,000 on the basis of present programs. However, if any new projects are authorized, it would be higher.

'Ependymoblastoma' Should Be 'Oligodendroglioma' Says Doc

DETROIT — (U.P.) — Those \$64 medical words that have long baffled the layman can be just as confusing to a doctor, one of them has admitted.

Dr. William Carpenter Mac Carthy, Sr., of the Mayo clinic, suggested to the International College of Surgeons that they try simplifying their language a bit.

As a start toward simplifying things, Dr. Mac Carthy chose for his subject at the 11th annual convention of the college's United States chapter "An International Nomenclature and Classification of Neoplasms."

Take the word "oligodendroglioma," he told reporters after his address. What's that mean?

No response.

It defines a certain form of tumor, Dr. Mac Carthy explained, but it doesn't say whether it's one of those nasty little tumors that

scampers about the body with a malignant glint in its eye, or one of the quiet little tumors that goes about its business in a shy and friendly fashion.

Therefore, to simplify matters, the Rochester, Minn., pathologist proposed that the term be scrapped and that "ependymoblastoma" be used instead.

Now there's a simple, straightforward word, Dr. Mac Carthy said.

It describes the same sort of ailment except that it makes it clear that the tumor is one of those rascals that acts in a malignant manner.

Clark Lets Estonians Stay After Deadlines

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Attorney General Tom Clark Thursday ordered a temporary stay for Estonian political refugees who had been ordered by immigration authorities to leave Miami, Fla., by 11 a.m. Thursday.

A spokesman for Clark explained that the stay had been authorized simultaneously with issuance of a directive to the Immigration and Naturalization Service to try to arrange for the Estonians' departure to "some other country in this hemisphere."

Later President Truman at his news conference reiterated the hope he expressed in New York Wednesday that our immigration policy could be arranged to admit political refugees to this country.

The Estonians, denied admittance to the United States, had been preparing to set sail in the small sloop which had brought them from Sweden. They were the first of 48 Estonians to arrive in this country in small vessels to seek a haven.
