proposed Columbia Valley Authority is an explosive issue this year in Washington state. Dr. Wood is the only Oregon candidate who has said anything about

it. He wants the CVA to provide "integrated, regional control" for flood control, irrigation, power, recreation, and protection of fish and wildlife. He also wants more federal money for Oregon, particularly for the Willamette Valley project.

Stockman Vs. Townsend
In the Second District (Eastern Oregon), Rep. Lowell Stockman, Pendleton wheat rancher, wants a third term, and is opposed by Lamar Townsend, Klamath Falls attorney.

Stockman's platform is similar to that of the other Republican congressmen, while he also wants full development of Eastern Oregon's resources, including McNary Dam and other irrigation and flood control projects.

Townsend, supporting price controls, public power and lower income taxes, takes Stockman to task for his voting record, including his votes against price control, authorization for UNRRA, and his votes for the Case Labor Bill and to return the U. S. Employment Service to the states.

from carbon monoxide fumes which caused them to lose consciousness and to crash their auto into a building on East Broadway Tuesday evening.

Witnesses said the car careened down Pearl St., turned onto Broadway, jumped the curb and struck a building at 328 East Broadway. The couple was found unconscious in the car by Dunbar Norton, 1809 Moss St., and Dean Axtell, 1861 Agate St.

After being revived at the hospital Tuesday night, Dillard told city police he remembered getting dizzy while driving on Seventh Ave. W. and that he recalled seeing the Eugene Hotel before losing consciousness. Mrs. Dillard said the last she remembered was when the car plunged through some bushes.

Damage to the car and the building was not extensive.

Four drivers chalked up minor damage to their cars Wednesday after they were involved in traffic accidents at Tenth and Olive Sts. and at East Broadway and Pearl St. Tuesday.

resulting now is caused by the fact that construction is still under way, which unavoidably holds up some traffic.

Businessmen on the north side of the highway have complained that cars from Eugene cannot reach their places without going into Springfield, turning around and coming back.

Ed Turnbull, chairman of the highway committee of the Eugene Chamber of Commerce said Wednesday that most of the businessmen affected were told four or five years ago that traffic was bound to become so heavy that some system like the present one would have to be installed and that, when it was built, it would be impossible for cars to cross over to reach their establishments.

He said they were discouraged from making big investments at the junction for this reason. This was confirmed by Earl Dickson, owner of a building at the junction, who said he was discouraged from building 12 years ago.

However, Dickson and others contend that they protested against plans for the setup months ago and got nowhere. They say that one cut across traffic separator would do much to relieve their trouble, but engineers contend that such a cut would create another spot where traffic crosses and would be a hazard.

plans once they had been approved by R. H. Baldock, state highway engineer, they said that minor changes could be made after construction was begun.

A plan to portray the traffic hazard created by the development through accident counts and the photographing of congestion there was put into effect with the commissioning of Gene Ezell, radio repairman at the junction, to take pictures during rush hours in the afternoons.

The group is independent of E. L. Dickson's one-man picketing campaign against the development, it was reported. Dickson started his protest Monday afternoon and was still carrying his signs up and down the junction Wednesday morning.

A committee of four, Pat Patterson, Mel Gans, Frank Cluser and William James was chosen to prepare a petition listing the grievances of the property owners and the "travelling public."

The next meeting of the group will be held Monday with S. G. Hatch chosen temporary chairman until that time.

CLINTON, Ia.—(AP)—A cafe proprietor, who isn't sure how much to charge for steak dinners now that OPA is gone, has decided to leave it up to the customers.

Magee said the new policy was designed to "get an idea of what to charge for meals." The cafe, which opened a month ago, has been charging \$1.75 to \$3.50 for dinners.
