

Radios to Help Power Service

Two-way radios to speed communication between headquarters and crews in the field have been ordered by the Eugene Water Board, it was disclosed Friday by Superintendent Ray Boals.

In case of another power outage such as occurred last Tuesday, the radios will aid in speed resumption of service, Boals said. At present a repair crew has no way of getting in touch with the main office except by waiting a telephone in the neighborhood where it is working.

Lines Busy

Often the crew must wait to complete a call because, during outage, a flood of calls comes in from headquarters and all lines are busy. The office has no way of contacting the crew by phone.

With the two-way radio system a crew can keep in constant touch with the office if necessary, and the office always can contact a crew in the field.

Help Cars

Boals said eight cars will be

equipped with radios, in the water department, on the line trucks and on repair trucks. The transmitter will be located at the steam generating plant and the Water Board will have its own direct telephone line to the transmitter.

No definite date for receipt of the new equipment has been announced but it is expected to arrive in the not too distant future.

The radio system will have a frequency which will not interfere with the two-way system of the Police Department.

Students of Art May Get Prize

Art students of this area will have an opportunity to win \$11,000 in prizes and scholarships to 50 leading American art schools in a contest sponsored by National Scholastic Magazine and the Meier and Frank Co., Portland. One of the scholarships is offered by the Portland Art Museum.

The contest is open to all students enrolled in public, private or parochial schools from the seventh through the twelfth grades. Students may submit their regular school work to a jury chosen by local art teachers for a two weeks' exhibition from Feb. 15 to March 1, 1947.

The work of local winners will be forwarded to the Fine Art Galleries at the Carnegie Institute in Pittsburgh. From the winners in the 43 regional exhibitions to be held in the United States this year, 1300 pieces will be selected for the National High School Art Exhibition.

British Said Planning To Use U S Arms Size

LONDON—(AP)—Well-qualified British military sources say the British empire has agreed in principle to the standardization of all its armaments on U.S. sizes and patterns.

In practice, these informants said, standardization would serve the United States by making such countries as Australia and New Zealand, in effect, "advanced bases" for U.S. forces in the event of future conflict.

Britain would gain the advantage of being able to order most of her land, air and naval weapons and munitions from America with considerable less trouble, and in far less time, than in the past.

National Forest Sells Old-Growth Lumber

The successful bid for 4,469,000 board feet of old-growth Douglas fir timber, by the Rosboro Lumber Co., Springfield, brings to \$2,210,-

000 board feet the total timber sold by the Willamette National Forest since July 1, 1946, J. R. Bruckart, forest supervisor, said Thursday.

The timber awarded in the Rosboro sale is located in the Fall Creek area, 37 miles from Springfield. The logs will be milled at

the Rosboro plant in Springfield. As is customary in forest service sales, 25 per cent of the proceeds will go to Lane County as payment in lieu of taxes. An additional 10 per cent will be reserved for construction of forest roads. Ceiling prices were bid for the timber.

'Wrong Way' Concedes Senate Entrance Hard

LOS ANGELES—(AP)—Douglas Corrigan conceded Thursday that he may not be elected next week to the U. S. Senate as the Prohibition Party's candidate, but he will have had a lot of
