Negligent homicide charges against Albert Miller, Independence, brought after the death of Nancy Temple, Eugene, in an automobile accident, were dismissed in Dallas circuit court Thursday, the Associated Press reported.

Miss Temple, daughter of Mrs. Zella Temple, Eugene, was injured in an accident near Salem May 24. She died as a result of her injuries July 1, in a Salem hospital.

R. S. Krenson, district attorney at Dallas, said the case likely will be resubmitted to the grand jury.

The dismissal came after the defense moved for such action on the ground that the indictment against Miller did not specify an act of violence which would have caused death.

At the opening session of a three-day writers' conference, he advised the region to quit looking to older areas for guidance.

"A community is not mature until it gets to the point where it doesn't care what the others are doing. Some communities are just like a writer who is always looking over someone's shoulder for a model. He's no good, either," Author Van Doren said.

He added that the region could play an important part in the nation's culture, and, citing the northwest's war production record, added, "Paul Bunyan came back during the war. We hope he came to stay."
