

Alaskan Cannery Destroyed by Fire
KETCHIKAN, Alaska, (AP)—The Nakat Packing Corp., plant at Union Bay, one of the largest in the area, was destroyed by a \$100,000 fire Friday.
A pilot who flew over the work-

ings said all cannery buildings except a small shed on a dock and the superintendent's house had been burned to the ground.
Two watchmen and a storekeeper were the only ones on duty as the plant had been closed down for the season. No one was injured.

Wallace Raps US and USSR

MADISON, Wis.—(AP)—Henry A. Wallace accuses the U. S. and Soviet Russia of "vigorously practicing their own brand of imperialism" and threatening world peace through mutual suspicion and self-righteousness.

This has reached "a point which threatens the peace and standard of living of every man, woman and child in the world," Wallace told the Wisconsin Assn. of Cooperatives Thursday night.

A "firm" and "frank" agreement on a program of genuine cooperation for world peace and prosperity must be reached between the two nations, Wallace said. He said this nation could not

Estonian Refugees Get Delays in Deportations

MIAMI, Fla.—(AP)—Prospects brightened Friday that the 48 Estonian political refugees who sailed to this country from Sweden might soon call the land of the Stars and Stripes home.

Thomas B. Shoemaker, deputy commissioner of immigration, told the group in sympathetic terms that deportation had been stayed until another order is issued by Attorney General Tom Clark. He said he did not know when it would be forthcoming and added there was no hurry.

Saw Bit Shortages Slow Building Plans

A longer work week as one possible means of increasing production of saw bits to meet the needs of the Veterans' Emergency Housing Program was suggested at a recent meeting of the saw bit producers industry advisory committee, the CPA reported Thursday in a release received by Charles Bayles, locality housing expediter.

Listed as on the advisory committee is the firm of Joseph E. Whitten, Spear and Jackson Manufacturing Co. of Eugene, managed by A. E. Schurb, who said Thursday that the company here is already working a 48-hour week and the labor shortage has prevented the addition of a second shift.

The company is considering going back to the wartime practice of hiring women in view of the lack of workers.

Saw bit production is 27 per cent above the 1945 monthly average, CPA figures show, but the heavy demand of the lumber industry in attempting to meet the needs of veterans' housing program has depleted the inventories of producers.

CPA also plans to get reports from the armed services on stocks of saw bits in warehouses with a view to having them declared surplus and thus assisting distribution.

Lumber Firms Merge; New Mill Constructed
ALBANY — (AP)—The merger of three firms to form a new lumber company capitalized at \$1,800,000 became known here Thursday.

The company, the Willamette National Lumber Co., was formed from the Corvallis Lumber Co., the Lumber Management Corp., Portland, and the Willamette National Lumber Co., Salem. Directors of the last firm, all Portlanders, will head the new company.

It is now constructing a \$400,000 mill at Foster, expected to have a capacity of 160,000 board feet a day. Timber holdings cover 2,000,000 acres, officials said.

At the present time, he said, Russia and the United States have "plenty of reason" to be suspicious of each other. Both are spending huge sums on new types of warfare, he said. Both are "vigorously practicing their own brand of imperialism" and "propagandizing and proselytizing for their own brand of imperialism," he said.

Wallace, ousted as secretary of commerce when he called for a re-direction of U. S. policy toward the Soviet Union, said there were many things he did not like about the Russians.

But, he said, there are "just as many things I don't like about our own attitude."

Progressives would be "horried," he said, if they had full information "about the way in which many of our Army and State Department officials in eastern Europe conspire with and back up the most reactionary elements."

"The world can't move forward with vigor and decision until some sort of firm agreement has been reached between the U. S. and Russia," Wallace said. "The present bargaining for spheres of influence is a concession to Republican imperialism, Red-baiting instincts which can only end in boom and bust: first scarcity, and then surplus and finally, war based on both political and economic fears."

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Firm Challenges CPA's Inquiries

PORTLAND — (AP)—Attorneys for a Grants Pass firm planned to challenge in federal court Friday the right of Civilian Production Administration to investigate delivery of building materials.

In line with a complaint filed Thursday, attorneys prepared to ask that the CPA be enjoined from executing subpoenas against the Cook Lumber Yard, Cook Lumber Products Co. and Ready Mix Cement Service.

The CPA had ordered the Grants Pass firm, doing business under the three names, to testify regarding delivery of construction

materials to builders, and open its books.

The Cook firm supplies the Grants Pass region, where some builders have declared defiance of CPA building regulations.

The complaint Thursday named the U. S. government and a number of government officials as defendants. It contended the CPA lacked authority to issue subpoenas, and that the President lacked authority to create the CPA.

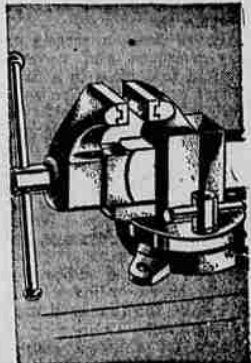
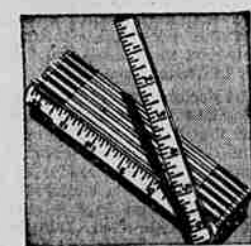
