Hong Kong Business Bombed by Racketeers

HONG KONG—(U.P.)—Four persons were seriously injured when a bomb exploded at the Luk Hoi Tung Hotel Tuesday night after the owner refused to pay protection money to gangsters who have been preying on restaurants and goldsmiths, police announced Wednesday.

It was the second such incident in two nights. On Monday night, the Golden City Restaurant was similarly bombed and three employees were injured. Several goldsmiths, who were threatened with letters demanding \$3,000 each, said they had decided to pay.

SPRINGFIELD Councilmen Get Bill for Sewers

SPRINGFIELD—A final bill for \$7796.56 due Oregon Installation Co. for work on the main trunk sewer here was presented to the city council at a meeting Tuesday night by Oren O. Beymer and Sigvald Moe, partners in the construction firm.

Beymer said construction on the line, including clean-up work, had been completed. Work on the \$100,000 job was begun last fall and was to have been completed by early December, 1945. However, contractors have been granted extensions of time because of labor and material shortages.

After discussing a bill for \$20, submitted by George Gilmore, 932 K St., for expenses arising from an attempt to locate a sewer riser to make a house connection, the council authorized the sewer committee to pay the Oregon Installation Co.'s claim if the sewers are found to be in satisfactory condition after an inspection Saturday morning. The council took no immediate action on the claim submitted by Gilmore, who said Wednesday he had employed a man to find the riser.

The council accepted a petition for a sewer from residents on Emerald Heights, but said no action could be taken until a means of paying for the improvement could be found.

Voters Name James To Position on Board

SPRINGFIELD—William E. James, Glenwood, was reelected to the Willamalane Park and Recreation District's board of directors by a 43-vote margin at an election held Tuesday in the city library.

James, one of the original board members, defeated C. R. Duncan, 166 South Ninth St., Springfield, by a 54 to 11 vote. James will remain president of the board for the rest of the year, when his present term expires. Board members will choose a successor to the presidency at that time.

The park district is composed of Springfield, Glenwood and surrounding territory. All resident property-owners were eligible to vote.

P-TA Radio Chairman To Discuss Discipline

SALEM—(U.P.)—The Columbia Basin Inter-Agency Committee met here Wednesday to discuss problems of the McKenzie and South Santiam Rivers, which are included in the proposed Willamette Valley Flood Control Project.

The committee includes representatives of the Department of Interior, Federal Power Commission, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Bonneville Power Administration, and U. S. Army Engineers.

The committee presented a scroll to Maj. Gen. Thomas M. Robins for his services as chairman of the committee while deputy chief of engineers of the Army Corps of Engineers.

The scroll was presented by Col. Theron D. Weaver, committee chairman, and North Pacific Division Army engineer.
