**Board of Trade  
Daily Limits Revised**

CHICAGO—(AP)—Trading limits on daily price fluctuations permitted on grains were revised to pre-war levels by the Chicago Board of Trade Wednesday. Wheat, barley and rye, which had been limited to a five-cent change-up or down—from the previous day's close, will be traded effective Nov. 15 under a 10 cents daily limit.

Since his elevation to the White House, it has been Mr. Truman's custom, while Congress is in session, to hold Monday morning conferences almost weekly with his democratic congressional leaders. The group includes President Pro Tempore Kenneth D. McKellar and Democratic Leader Alben W. Barkley of the Senate and Speaker Sam Rayburn and Democratic Leader John W. McCormack in the House.

"Now the group will be broadened to include the Republican leaders," the administration official predicted. It was pointed out that Mr. Truman has often invited GOP congressional leaders to White House conferences in the past for special occasions.

**Supplies, Prices  
Increases Seen**

"Removal of ceilings on building materials will undoubtedly stimulate production of certain items which have been in short supply, notably finished lumber, flooring, shingles and shakes," Charles Bayles, locality housing expediter, said Wednesday.

Freight differentials which have acted to restrict shipment of building materials to this area also will be overcome as a result of the removal of ceilings, the expediter pointed out.

**Prices to Rise**  
"On the other hand," Bayles said, "the stimulus will occur through price increases, and, if manufacturers and suppliers are not extremely careful in their bidding for materials, and in their markup for sale, items for which there is little or no competition could skyrocket and leave the building industry in a much worse position than at present."

The expediter added that the home building industry is essentially privately-operated, and the success of the whole housing program hinges on the ability of the industry to keep costs "at the lowest possible level."

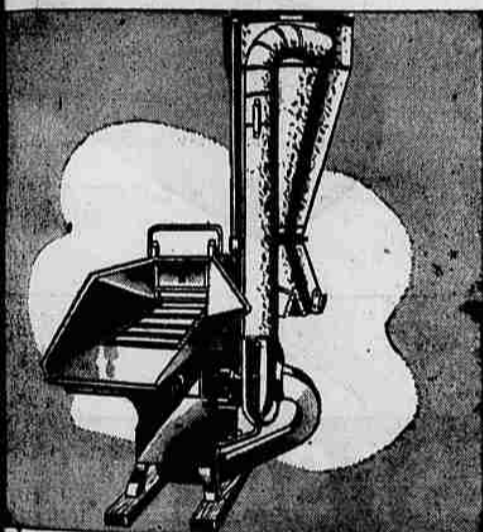
