

### Soviet UN Man Killed by Robber

NEW YORK — (AP) — Gregory Stadnik, 42, an Ukrainian delegate to the United Nations, was wounded in the thigh early Thursday during a holdup of a Manhattan delicatessen.

He was taken to Roosevelt Hospital where his condition was reported not serious.

Police said Stadnik and A. D. Zienan, another Soviet delegate, met two gunmen emerging from a delicatessen which the thugs had robbed of \$150.

Apparently one of the thugs mistook the delegates for detectives and opened fire, police said. No attempt was made to rob them.

### Increased Sugar Ration Predicted

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Reliable government sources said Thursday the basic sugar ration for consumers will be boosted by one-third early next spring, probably in April.

At the same time, they said, industrial users such as soft drink and food manufacturers will get a comparable increase by having their allocations hiked from 60 to 70 per cent of their 1940-41 base ration.

These sources said an anticipated improvement in Cuban sugar shipments will make the increase possible. But they said there is no prospect sugar rationing can be abandoned completely before the spring of 1948.

### Camera Gets High Photos

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Scientists who sent a motion picture camera aloft in a German V-2 rocket obtained photos of earth at an altitude of 65 miles, they disclosed Thursday.

At this altitude more than one-half of the United States theoretically would have been visible to an observer with unlimited eyesight and unobstructed vision.

The camera, of course, failed to take in this much territory. The best shot was obtained at around 65 miles altitude and covers an estimated 40,000 square miles of earth at the horizon, with the camera around 720 miles away.

It shows clouds between earth and the camera; the earth is distinguishable and the sky and earth may be seen at the horizon. Scientists said the earth's curvature may be noted in this picture.

Some of the other photos were at an altitude too high for landmarks to be distinguishable but some experts believed one photo showed the Boulder Dam and the Colorado River from an altitude of about 80 miles.

### Taxpayers Cough Up When Agents Added

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — The Bureau of Internal Revenue's announcement last year that its staff of investigators would be greatly increased to ferret out income tax evasions caused 110,000 Americans to rush to Uncle Sam with an additional \$170,000,000.

The effect of the announcement on taxpayers with uneasy consciences was revealed by E. I. McLarny, deputy commissioner of internal revenue, at a Tax Executives Institute dinner Wednesday night.

### Shanghai Drives For UN Branch Office

SHANGHAI — (AP) — In response to a suggestion by United Nations Secretary-General Trygve Lie, civic leaders and newspapers in Shanghai Thursday opened a campaign to establish a UN branch center here.

Morning editions displayed pictures and stories of a proposed Shanghai skyscraper designed by Architect Paul C. Chelazzi as a site for the branch headquarters. Lie has suggested that seven such centers be set up throughout the world.

### Wife Earns Too Much So Cop Wants Divorce

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — An attractive Australian war bride who makes \$300 a month as a drive-in restaurant carhop was sued for divorce Thursday.

Traffic Patrolman Robert D. Cutts, 23, ex-Navy petty officer, said his wife of three years, Eileen Mary, 21, made him "sick, nervous and distressed." He complained it was impossible to live with a woman making that much money.

### Two Germans Freed

FRANKFURT — (AP) — The German news agency Dana reported from Stuttgart Thursday that U.S. Army security officials have released two of the 15 former SS men and Hitler Youth arrested in connection with recent bombings in the Stuttgart area. The two were freed for lack of evidence, it was said. Twelve of the 13 now held have confessed, the Army said.
