Search for Mattson Kidnap
Goes Into 11th Year for FBI

WASHINGTON—The FBI has begun the 11th year of its search for the kidnaper-killer of 10-year-old Charles Fletcher Mattson, still hopeful that the mystery will be solved.

More than 25,000 persons have been questioned and every sci-entific aid has been employed by the FBI since the boy was whisked away from his Tacoma, Wash., home as he played with his Christmas toys on Dec. 27, 1936.

The FBI's inability thus far to solve the Mattson case is one of only two failures of its kind on the agency's record. The other involved the abduction of Peter David Levine of New Rochelle, N.Y., on Feb. 24, 1938. The Levine boy, too, was killed.

When the intruder was unable to find any money, he grabbed Charles and fled. He left a note demanding \$28,000 with instruc-tions on how it should be paid.
