

Installation Billed by IOOF

A joint installation of more than 350 officers from 30 Oregon IOOF lodges will be held Jan. 14, 7:30 p.m. at McArthur Court, under sponsorship of Spencer Lodge No. 5, IOOF, and Eugene Rebekah Lodge No. 55, IOOF. The program will be public.

Grand Master A. J. Lenon, Portland, and his staff of grand lodge officers, and Marion Wilson, president of the Rebekah Assembly, with her staff, will act as installing officers.

All Odd Fellows and Rebekahs and their families, as well as the general public, will be invited to attend the free ceremony.

A dinner at 5:45 p.m. at the Osburn Hotel will precede the public ceremony.

The program at McArthur Court will be opened by the Eugene High School band. Band selections and selections by the a cappella choir from Eugene High School will precede installation of officers.

The grand marshals will then be introduced, followed by more music from the band and choir. The president of the Rebekah Assembly and the grand master of IOOF will be introduced next, and will speak.

Music by the Eugene Gleemen and a benediction will close the program.

Formal dress will be in order for all officers.

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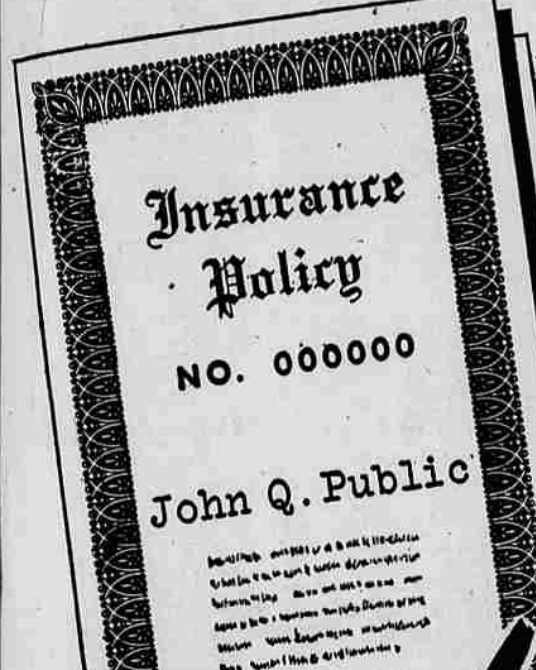

A leadership training school, sponsored by the Community Council of Religious Education of Eugene and participated in by Eugene and Springfield churches, will be held at the First Presbyterian Church of Eugene on Jan. 13 and 14, 21 and 22, 27 and 28. The Rev. Hugh N. McCallum of the First Christian Church is in charge of arrangements.

Another Entry Made In Old Clock 'Contest'

Another old Seth Thomas clock of the type featured in the Register-Guard on Sunday, Dec. 29, is owned by Mrs. Ruth Addleman, 1253 Ferry St., Eugene. Since the story about an old clock at Eugene Fire Department was published on that date, several Eugeneans have reported ownership of similar clocks.

Mrs. Addleman said the one-day clock had been in her family for 73 years, and that it still runs. Information provided by Jeweler Dale Allen of Eugene indicates that Mrs. Addleman's clock was made during the period from 1823 to 1840 when the Seth Thomas company was manufacturing that type of timepiece. It would be from 106 to 123 years old.

TRENTON, N.J.—(AP)—Edmore Herpin, 95, the sleepless wonder of Trenton who once worked two jobs to prove he never slept, died here—in his sleep.

Herpin was found in his hermit's shack three days ago completely helpless but wide awake. He was removed to the Mercer Hospital and after a day of sleep he died. The hospital blamed an intestinal ailment and old age.

Herpin claimed he had never slept in his life. His hut did not have a bed. Herpin had said he did all his resting in a rocking chair, while he was reading.

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55 Disabled Veterans Receive Special Autos

Fifty-five Oregon veterans who lost one or both legs or the use of them now have received free automobiles under a \$30,000,000 federal program, Frank Sias, Veterans Administration representative in this area, said Saturday.

The 55 cars paid for thus far represent actual deliveries to disabled veterans. Applications have been approved for 115 in all, less than half the number believed eligible in Oregon, Sias said.

Veterans with leg disabilities and residing in this area may discuss their eligibility at the VA contact office in the Red Cross building here.
