situation. He said his group was expanding in Eugene to take care of an increase in patients but that "to expand in two places with an organization such as ours is very difficult."

Wright said the clinic committee "believes it is necessary to have the backing of an organized group. An individual here would have difficulty obtaining an office or obtaining equipment for a clinic."

C. F. Wright, manager of the Pacific Hospital Assn., promised cooperation with doctors already here, but said, "I don't see any practical way for either of us to build a clinic here without encroaching on the other. In medicine that is something you don't do. You should be able to get financial backing from here or in Eugene for your doctors so they can establish their own clinic."

Five Men Arraigned On Criminal Charges

Dates for hearings or pleadings were set Tuesday as Circuit Judge G. E. Skipworth and District Attorney C. E. Luckey conducted arraignments of five men in Lane County courthouse.

Elzer Ernest Dunn, 17, appearing on an information of the district attorney charging him with grand larceny, will enter his plea to the charges at 10 a. m. Wednesday. A defense lawyer will be appointed by the court.

Dunn's charge is based on the alleged theft of an ambulance from G. L. White, Eugene, on Nov. 28. The vehicle was later found wrecked. Dunn had previously waived an indictment in Eugene justice court.

The Lane County sheriff's office said that Dunn is also wanted in Salem on check charges and for his alleged escape from the Marion County jail after he was arrested in that city. Dunn was arrested in Eugene on check charges two days after the alleged escape.

William M. Isbell will appear for a hearing Friday at which the court will consider a motion of the district attorney that Isbell's parole be revoked because of charges that he allegedly uttered and published a forged bank check.

Isbell entered a plea of guilty to forgery by endorsement in Eugene last July and was sentenced to serve two years in the state penitentiary. He was paroled immediately but was later arrested in California on check charges and was brought back to Eugene after being sentenced to a term in a California penal institution.

The district attorney also linked Isbell with the theft of an airplane from the Springfield Flying Service. The plane was later discovered abandoned in Cottage Grove.

Lewis Clark Metzger, 43, Cottage Grove, entered a plea of guilty to charges of contributing to the delinquency of a minor in that city. The alleged offense was said to have been committed Jan. 2. Judge Skipworth set 10 a. m. Thursday for sentencing and fixed bail at \$2000.

Robert L. Norrell and Claude E. Shields entered pleas of not guilty to bad check charges. Bail for Shields, facing a count of knowingly uttering and publishing a forged bank check, was fixed at \$1500. Norrell, charged with forgery, may post the same amount.

French Paratroop Operation 'Success'

PARIS (AP)—French forces fanning out from Hanoi extended their control to Namdinh by a pre-dawn parachute assault and approached a link-up with troops from Haiduong, dispatches from Indochina said Tuesday.

The French General Staff said the parachute drop on the north bank of a canal near Namdinh in the lower reaches of the River Rouge south of Hanoi was "completely successful" and that mop-up operations in Namdinh itself were proceeding.

Meanwhile, French Colonial Minister Marius Moutet, completing his investigation of the situation in Indochina, prepared to leave Saigon Wednesday by plane to report to the French government in Paris.

MANILA (AP)—A Viet-Nam communique broadcast Tuesday by radio Hanoi reported 240 French troops were killed, 30 were wounded and two tanks were knocked out in a 10 hour battle in Hanoi Friday.

The broadcast was recorded here by the Associated Press. The broadcast said numerous detachments of French infantry, supported by 20 tanks, armored cars and fighting planes, launched simultaneous attacks at 5:30 a. m. against Viet-Nam positions in the Ngoc Ha quarter of northwest Hanoi. The quarter includes Kim Ma pagoda, Leigui cathedral and Hommel beer factory.

Criminal Offenses Increase 31 Per Cent

crimes, 65 break and enter cases, 243 larceny cases, and 20 forgery cases.

Of eight robberies, two were cleared by arrests. Nine suicides were investigated, and 58 of 73 juvenile runaways were arrested.

Of 72 larceny cases involving more than \$50, 18 were cleared by arrest and \$2169 in stolen property was recovered. There were 213 larceny cases involving less than \$50, and of these 24 were cleared by arrests and \$702 recovered. Stolen bicycles totaled 275 during the year, resulting in nine arrests for bicycle theft.

Property Recovered
City police recovered \$140,391 in stolen property during 1946, as compared with recovery of \$93,726 in 1945. Fines assessed for crimes during the past year totaled \$6568.60, as compared with \$3176 during the previous year.

Revenues from municipal court in 1946, for both traffic and criminal offenses, totaled \$43,067.10.

The city traffic department reported the arrest of 941 persons on basic rule charges, and payment of fines totaling \$11,032. Drunk drivers totaled 71, paying \$10,725 into the city coffers. Police arrested 43 persons on reckless driving charges, collecting \$1970 in fines; 902 stop sign violators paid \$4171 in fines, and six hit and run drivers paid \$100 in fines.

C. Wright, 212 Friendly Hall, 7:30 p. m., and a class in advanced conversational Spanish under Esquiro Narro, 19 Friendly Hall, 7:30 p. m., and beginning painting, Jack Wilkinson, instructor, in the north wing of the architecture building at 7:30 p. m.

Five classes of the extension offerings were started Monday night. Others will have their initial meetings on Wednesday and Thursday evenings.
