for its time-serving "guests." "Under no circumstances should younger children be placed in this jail," the report concluded. Lane officials said that present policy is against this practice and

that upstairs juvenile detention quarters are reasonably adequate anyhow. Both juveniles and women prisoners are lodged in separate rooms upstairs; each room has its own toilet, shower and beds. Jailer Ralph McIntyre said that the facilities for cleanliness are present but some of his "customers" occasionally smash windows and spread filth on the floor. The jail, which serves the city of Eugene as well as county of-

ficers, was spic and span Thursday morning. Grand juries, which are obligated to inspect the jail as a part of their regular duties, have generally found cleanliness and sanitation practices to be good since the 1943 overhaul. District Attorney Ed Luckey said Thursday.

Vincent Auriol New President of France

PARIS (AP)—Vincent Auriol, veteran Socialist leader, Thursday was elected president of the Fourth French Republic at Versailles palace.

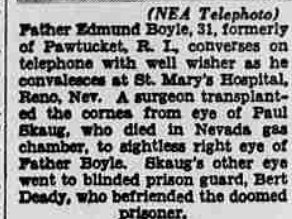
An unofficial count gave Auriol 542 votes with 242 going to the MRP candidate Auguste Champetier De Ribes, 122 to Jules Gassner of the Radical Socialists and 60 to Michel Clemenceau, son of the "Old Tiger" of France, representing the PRL.

The Communists did not advance a candidate, but supported Auriol.

The voting was by the combined houses of the new parliament—the national assembly and the council of the republic.

It was the second honor in two days for Auriol, 62, long known as a peacemaker in French politics. He was chosen Tuesday as president of the national assembly.

applauded vigorously when Jacques Duclos, vice president of the assembly, announced the choice of Auriol as the first popularly chosen and regularly elected president of France since 1940.

State Income Taxes Return \$26,000,000

SALEM—(AP)—Income taxpayers paid a total of \$25,853,833 into the state coffers last year, the Oregon Tax Commission reported Thursday.

Assessments totaled \$26,446,756. Corporations filed 4,693 returns, including 413 delinquents, and 300,568 individual returns, including 32,174 delinquents were filed. The income tax division said its total expenses during 1946 were \$278,104, or 1.07 per cent of the net collections.

Hugh McCallum Red Cross Chief

Eugene Girl Lead in Play

Le Jeune Griffith, Eugene senior in journalism, will play the lead role in the University of Oregon theater production, "I Remember Mama," popular Broadway comedy scheduled for campus presentation Feb. 7, Horace W. Robinson, director, announced Wednesday.

The first play for winter term, "I Remember Mama" is a two-act comedy dealing with the life of an immigrant family in San Francisco about the turn of the century. Performances will be Feb. 7 and 8, and 11 to 15 in Johnson Hall. Robinson will direct the play assisted by James Bronson, Eugene drama senior.

Other members of the cast: William Countryman, Florence Hawkesworth, Marilyn Rowling, Marilyn Wherry, Kenneth Lomax, and Emelie Jackall, all of Eugene. Sharing lead honors with Mrs. Griffith will be Clifton James, Oregon City sophomore who played a major role last term in "Dark of the Moon."

City Street Renaming Committee to Meet

If plans for renaming and renumbering streets and homes in Eugene and Springfield meet with the unanimous approval of a committee of citizens at city hall Thursday night, maps of the plan will be made to feel out public opinion on the issue.

Planning Consultant Howard Buford is drawing a map to show how the committee's earlier suggestions would change the names of most city streets and provide a uniform system of numbering houses and business establishments.

The committee suggested that all streets running east and west have numerical names, beginning with Eleventh Ave. as Division Ave. Using that plan, Tenth Ave. would become First Ave., Broadway would become Second Ave., etc. They also proposed that numbers instead of letters be used in Springfield, making A St. become First St., B St. become Second St., etc.

The north-south axis between the two cities would be Garden Way and Riverview Sts. All streets running north and south would be given names starting with the alphabet. When the 26 letters of the alphabet had been used, two and three syllable names would be used. Willamette St. probably would retain its name under that plan.
