

Big Bill Tilden Begins Sentence

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — Nine months at hard labor stretched out today before William T. (Big Bill) Tilden, former monarch of the tennis court, following sentence on a morals charge involving a 14-year-old boy.

Routine county jail procedure, fingerprinting, form - filling and the like, occupied Tilden's new life - beginning at 83 - as he awaited assignment to a road gang where tennis will be so much dream stuff.

Graying, stoop-shouldered Tilden, the net wizard who blazed a triumphant trail through the golden '20s, swayed and almost fell Thursday when Superior Judge A. A. Scott passed sentence.

Tilden had pleaded guilty to the charge of contributing to the boy's delinquency, but obviously expected clemency.

"In view of your tendencies," Judge Scott told the ashen-faced athlete, "I think it would be dangerous to let you go free now."

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Feud Results In Free 'Tyin'

NEWPORT, Ky. — (AP) — Free weddings, perhaps even with bonuses, were in prospect here as a result of a feud between two of the marrying justices in this northern Kentucky Gretna Green.

The feud developed after Magistrate Charles (Dud) Derrick moved out of his own district and set up in the bailiwick of Magistrate John E. (Jigger) Wallace.

Derrick promptly invited the wedding trade by advertising free ceremonies.

Judge Wallace heard of the free marriage offer and countered that "when the time comes that 'Dud' marries them for nothing, then I'll give each of my couples a \$5 wedding present along with tying the knot with no fees attached."

Derrick replied that his competitor was "nuts."

"He gets 80 per cent of the weddings now and he would be broke in a month's time if he gave anything away," he said.

Derrick said he was satisfied in getting a marriage "now and then" and that he had sent some clients to Judge Wallace but Wallace replied that he was sent one couple which still owed him \$8 for a license and blood test.

Derrick charged that sometimes Judge Wallace's boys "try to steal my couples and I have to go to the judge's office and get them back."

Mother of Six Fights Eviction

PORTLAND — (AP) — The mother of six children Thursday said she planned to take four of them into court here Friday when she faces eviction charges brought by her sister.

Mrs. Rosalie Alexander, 30, said she and the four youngsters live in a four-room duplex apartment owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Shaw. The suit of the Shaws, charging the sister of Mrs. Shaw with non-payment of rent and damage to the property, will be heard before district court.

The two families occupy adjoining units.

Order of Buggy Ride Offers Aid to Solons on Lobbyists

With lobbyists beginning to swarm in Salem, Eugene's Order of the Buggy Ride is about to come to the rescue of the State Legislature, H. J. Cox, custodian of some of the order's most vital equipment, announced the campaign Thursday in a letter to Gov. Earl Snell, whom he addressed in the latter's capacity as Keeper of the State Stables for the order.

Salem, he pointed out, "is confronted with the biennial migration of the customary large herd of 'wild asses,'... led by 'jacks' of uncertain if not loose lineage, all of whom are cavorting, et cetera, on the greensward and through the aisles and stalls of our State Stables, flaunting a self-inflicted 'sweatband' labeled, 'Members, 3rd House.'"

The legislature already has taken steps to cope with the invasion of lobbyists by providing a special room for them so they can be kept out of the way of senators and representatives who are trying to get a little work done, but the Order of the Buggy Ride is fearful that this measure will not be sufficient to keep the "third house" subdued. In fact, Cox intimates, the order may induce these gentry as members as a means of keeping them under more rigid control.

"Therefore," he wrote Snell, "upon approval of the Keeper of the Stables (Snell), I will within a short time authorize the 'Buckaroo Division' of the order to start a roundup and, after corraling them in the Marion Hotel, then and there' subject the entire herd to the approved treatment of the

Portland Company Named in Trust Suit

CHICAGO — (AP) — A government suit was on file in federal court Friday against the Phillips Screw Co., Portland, Ore., and 17 other manufacturers of screws and screw drivers, charging violation of anti-trust laws in the manufacture and sale of the so-called "Phillips" crew and associated tools.

The suit, filed by the Justice Department, charged the Phillips Co., the patent-holding firm, and the other manufacturers with price-fixing, patent-pooling, cartels and other restraints of trade.

The government alleged that the defendants since 1933 had used patent licenses on cross-recessed head screws and screw drivers to cloak a price-fixing scheme. It also charged them with having set up a cartel under which domestic licensees agreed not to sell "Phillips" screws or screw drivers outside this country, and foreign licensees agreed not to ship to this country.

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Missing Plane Hunt Continues

KLAMATH FALLS — (AP) — The search for Robert Rubottom, missing McMinnville flier, centered Friday in the Woods Valley-Diamond Lake region north of here.

Private pilots and an Army Air Force search and rescue unit from Hamilton Field, Calif., were taking part in the search.

In addition there was a possibility the Russian shepherd dogs of John Black, Ogden, Utah, would be called in. The dogs, credited with being used in finding five airplane wrecks in the last year, are at Roseburg, where Black is preparing to search for Vernon Coulter and his mother, Portland, missing since Nov. 1 on a flight from Red Bluff, Calif., to Hillsboro.

Black said he would fly here if the Coulter family would release him.

Rubottom disappeared last week on a flight from here to McMinnville.

Girl Born With Tooth Has Rival in Chicago

VANCOUVER, B. C. — (CP) — Dorothy Marie Molloy of Vancouver is only three weeks old but she smiles for photographers and shows her one tooth.

She was born with a tooth ready and waiting for the first bite and now is expecting two more.

"She seems rather proud of herself," said her mother, Mrs. J. L. Molloy.

Dorothy Marie has a rival in the tooth derby, seven-week-old Jennifer Lynn of Chicago who was born with two teeth.

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Retail Sales Volume Rises

NEW YORK — (AP) — Clearance sales continued to attract many shoppers in the week ended Wednesday, boosting retail volume moderately above the preceding week and 22 to 26 per cent ahead of the corresponding week ago, Dun & Bradstreet reported Friday.

"Consumers generally were critical of quality and compared prices carefully before completing purchases," the business research firm said. "In many cases the demand for quality resulted in the failure of goods to sell despite further price reductions."

Interest in furs centered on mouton, muskrat and Persian lamb, but sales were affected adversely by mild weather.

Some clearance of men's suits were reported but were very limited in scope. Demand remained close to the high levels of previous weeks.

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A-Bomb Tips Plentiful
WASHINGTON — (AP) — An average of five persons a day "discover" a better way to make atomic bombs.

Atomic Energy Commission officials said people are sending in suggestions ranging from how to synthesize uranium to requests for million dollar "research" grants.

One man wrote from Florida that he had discovered a way to purify uranium by using Florida mud.

Another, a veteran, said he'd heard a rumor that the bomb never existed, but was just propaganda to frighten Japan into defeat.

"Can I spread this rumor, or would that be unpatriotic?" he asked anxiously.

Many write to recommend that the commission take over caves in their neighborhood for anti-bomb defense. Such letters are referred to the National Speleological Society. (Speleology is the study of caves).

Others are turned over to the Inventors' Council for examination for possible usable ideas.
