Violence Mars Bombay Fete

BOMBAY — (AP) — Authorities reported Monday that at least five persons were stabbed and several others seared by acid throwers in Bombay during Sunday's celebration of India's independence day.

Police fired several times to disperse Hindu-Muslim rioters and police snipers manned rooftops in the temple area with orders to shoot acid-throwers on sight.

Few disturbances were reported elsewhere in India, where the celebration consisted mainly of flag raising ceremonies and mass recitations of a pledge to achieve complete Indian independence.

Dispatches from Lahore said that seven Moslem League leaders who were arrested Friday night during a police raid on the office of the League's National Guard were released Sunday night.

Six of the Moslems refused to leave prison until more than 100 other league members, arrested for demonstrating against the raid, were also released. Finally they were "pushed out of jail," they said.

Capone 'Penniless' At End, Says Lawyer

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — Prohibition-era gang leader Al Capone, once estimated to have \$20,000,000, died penniless, his attorney said Sunday night.

"I think he died broke, and I'm sure it is untrue that he was fabulously wealthy," Attorney Abraham Teitelbaum said as he boarded a plane for Chicago.

"As far as I know, Capone didn't leave any money or any will. After all, he hadn't been active since 1931 when he went to prison on income tax charges. He still owed the government money. If he had any money, the government would have found it."

"I think he lived on the generosity of his brothers and other members of his family."

Teitelbaum said that the Miami, Fla., Palm Island home where Capone died Saturday night was a "nice place—but nothing compared to the homes of certain film stars here."

Cop Is Interpreter For Deaf-Mutes

BALTIMORE — (AP) — When deafmute lawbreakers "tell it to the judge," Patrolman Joseph C. Sandbeck does the interpreting.

He learned sign language at the age of eight, when an older brother was a student at the Maryland State School for the Deaf.

Sandbeck says jurists have called on him more than 100 times in the past 23 years to expedite "hearings" for offenders who can only talk with their hands.

If two deaf-mutes charged with assault on each other start arguing it out before the magistrate with their fingers, Sandbeck is called in to do the talking.

"I enjoy the job," he says. "It means an extra \$5 a week when my services are needed in other than local police courts."

Betrothed Pair Both Polio Victims

PORTLAND — (AP) — Harold Metzer, 25, and Elvyn Tilden, 31, World War II veterans who have one good leg and two good arms between them, are planning to be married as soon as they find a house without steps.

The two Portlanders, a former Air Corps soldier and a Wave, announced their engagement at the veterans hospital, just six months after each of them was stricken by infantile paralysis.

India Lawyers Oppose Jury System

MADURA, India. — (AP) — The lawyers' conference of Madras province, one of the most reputable legal organizations in India, has appealed for abolition of the jury system on the grounds that the evils it leads to "are much greater than the benefits."

Numerous publications have claimed that the jury system, brought in by the British, was not suited to the Indian mentality.

Most commentators have asserted that the opportunity for "fixing" a jury was much greater than "fixing" a judge, and that juries in India are more inclined to be biased toward friends and neighbors.

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Add Feathers: It's 'Flappers'

KELOWNA, B. C. — (CP) — Shades of the 1920's! Sweater girls are again becoming "flappers."

Hon. L. H. Evers, trade and industries minister, revealed that B.C. scientists have come up with a method of making a new fabric from chicken feathers.

Mr. Evers, establishing himself as an authority on the subject, told members of the B.C. Fruit Growers' Association convention that it takes the plumage from a mere 30 broilers to turn out a size 18 sweater.

Like any wool, the new fabric is said to be warmer, softer and lighter and can be dyed any color.

The feathers from 38 chickens will, under the new process, become a full man's suit. With 13,000,000 pounds of feathers going to waste in Canada, the clothing shortage would be solved, or so Mr. Evers says.

Solon Presses Drive To Ban Conscription

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Rep. Landis (R-Ind.) asked Congress Monday to declare itself in favor of an international ban against compulsory military training.

He introduced a resolution calling upon the President, the secretary of state and the U.S. delegate to the United Nations Organization to "work unceasingly for an international agreement" for elimination of compulsory training "from the policies and practices of all nations."

The Army and Navy are urging Congress to require universal military training in this country. Military leaders call it, together with a powerful air force and a strong navy, the "basic needs" to defend the United States from surprise attack.

The six committees working with Dickinson were responsible for the details of the dance. The proceeds from the dance were added to the senior class fund which will be used toward a gift or donation to the university by the outgoing class, according to Miss Fancher.

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
