SPRINGFIELD—Final consideration of six options on small parcels of land adjoining the proposed park site at Twelfth and G Sts. will be given by the board of directors of the Willamalane Park and Recreation District when they meet Tuesday evening. The options expire Jan. 31.

Park Superintendent Walter F. Hansen said acquisition of the property would increase the park site to 15 acres and align its borders with the city limits. The district purchased 12 acres for nearly \$10,000 and has received a donation of almost two acres from a Eugene realtor.

Mortgage Investments Show Big Increase

Brazil to Honor A. R. Moore

Dr. Arthur Russell Moore, professor of general physiology in the University of Oregon, has been awarded the Order of the Southern Cross by the Brazilian government, it was announced here Saturday by Dr. Howard R. Taylor, acting dean of the university graduate school and head of the psychology department.

The award, to be presented to Dr. Moore in San Francisco Thursday, was made in recognition of the Oregon professor's services to the Brazilian government during the summer of 1946.

Dr. Moore gave a series of seven lectures last summer at the Institute de Biofisica of the University of Brazil, Rio de Janeiro, and assisted in the studies which started a survey of marine biology there.

He went to South America at the invitation of the Instituto de Biofisica and under the auspices of the U. S. state department.

All of Dr. Moore's lectures will be published in Portuguese by the Instituto. The first, "Excitation," has already been issued.

Dr. Moore, a member of the university psychology department since 1934, will leave the campus Wednesday for San Francisco for presentation of the award, which will be made by Jose Cochrane de Alencar, Brazilian consul general in San Francisco.

Coast Forger Gets Two Years

Two years in the penitentiary for forgery were meted out to John Allen Morris, Florence, in circuit court Monday and District Attorney Ed Luckey commented that this was one of the first steps in a move for greater police vigilance in western Lane.

Luckey, who spent two days last week investigating a highway death near Florence, said Saturday that law enforcement in that area has been difficult because of an insufficient number of police officers for the territory involved.

He said that state police and local officials are doing as well as they can but that they need help. He did not divulge details of tightening-up steps expected.

Morris pleaded guilty to the charge of forgery by endorsement. He allegedly cashed a Siuslaw Forest Products Co. paycheck by signing the name of the payee as endorsement and representing himself as the payee.

Mythical Sale Greys Dealers

CLEVELAND — (U.P.) — Cleveland auto dealers are greying over the tale of a haunted 1946 Buick—for sale at \$200.

No strings. Just \$200. Auto dealers said they have received dozens of calls from persons who had heard that somewhere in the city was a 1946 Buick for sale at that price.

There were two stories they told the astonished dealers. One was that two men went hunting in Michigan at the beginning of winter and were found, 10 weeks later, frozen to death in the car. The grief-stricken wife of the owner, the story goes, offered the car for sale for \$200, just to get rid of it.

Another version was that the owner was asphyxiated in the new Buick and found in it a long time afterward. Relatives wanted to rid themselves of the car, convinced that the spirit of the owner was still at the wheel. It got around the relatives were offering both car and ghost for \$200.

Dealers said the stories were fantastic. Especially the price.

Gas Rate Increase Explained by Manager

D. W. Olsen, general manager for Northwest Cities Gas Co., pointed out Monday that an increase in gas rates for 11 bakery consumers actually should have been given as 20 instead of 39.03 per cent.

"The 39.03 per cent increase was reflected on 11 consumers who had been carried over on a heating rate that was discontinued on Dec. 31, 1944. These consumers should have been placed on a higher rate at the time, but through an oversight were not. Consequently, this 39.03 per cent

increase does not reflect a true picture of the heating increase," Olsen said.
