PASCO — (AP) — An aroused Columbia Basin citizenry Wednesday proposed four plans of action for combating the reported plans of the Atomic Energy Commission to take over a large area of the South Columbia Basin Irrigation District as an addition to the Hanford Atomic Energy Project.

The proposed program called for:

1. Organization of all interested parties in the state to make a protest.
2. Action by the state's congressional delegation to authentic the rumored withdrawal and seek

an immediate decision one way or another.

3. A visit by Governor Wallgren to approach President Truman personally in opposition to the move.

4. Designation of a delegate to work against the withdrawal. James O'Sullivan of Spokane, research manager of the Columbia Basin Commission, was proposed.

(While the protest meeting was being carried on, the Atomic Energy Commission issued a statement in Washington, D. C., that no decision had been made to place restriction upon more land for the Hanford project.

(Rather, it said, the commission is discussing the possibility of removing restriction from land already held. The commission's statement stressed, however, that it "has not made any determination either to continue or remove restriction. . .")

Church to Pray For Newsmen

NEW YORK — (AP) — The United Lutheran Church in America set aside Jan. 29-Feb. 4 as "pray-for-the-press week."

"Ordinarily people criticize and cuss reporters and editors," a statement from the church said, adding the church was asking its 1,810,076 members to pray for newsmen every evening at 7 o'clock during the week.

Dr. F. Eppling Reinartz, secretary of the church, recommended this prayer:

"Let us pray for all who gather and publish news, that they may discharge their trust in the interests of godliness and good order."

Marian Anderson to Make First Eugene Appearance Thursday

Marian Anderson, contralto, will sing five groups of songs in her program Thursday evening at McArthur Court, sponsored by Civic Music Assn. for its membership.

The program begins at 8:15, doors to open at 7:30 p.m.

The first group will include: "Ardent Longing" (Johann Georg Ahle); "Vieni, Che poi Sereno" (Christoph W. Gluck); "Odio la Pastorella" (Vincenzo Bellini); "Le Violette" (Alessandro Scarlatti).

The second group is made up of four Schubert compositions, familiar to concert-goers: "An die Leier," "Abschied," "Der Jungling und der Tod," and "Der Erlkönig."

Third on the program is the aria, "Ne me refuse pas," from "Herodias" by Massenet, and the intermission will follow.

On her return to the stage, the singer will give a group of five popular numbers: "The Sally Gardens," an Irish tune, arranged by Benjamin Britten; "A Maiden" (Christopher Thomas); "Yarmouth Fair," Norfolk folk song, arranged by Peter Warlock; "Summer Night," (Armstrong Gibbs) and "When Lights go rolling round the Sky," (John Ireland).

The closing group will be a selection of four Negro spirituals: "O, what a beautiful city" arranged by Edward Boatner; "Let us break bread together" arranged by Lawrence; "Crucifixion" (John Payne) and "Honor, Honor" arranged by Johnson.

Franz Rupp will be her accompanist.

Miss Anderson has sung three times in the White House, the second time for the royal guests from England, King George and Queen Elizabeth. This is her twelfth consecutive coast-to-coast tour of America, and her first appearance in Eugene.

Atomic Control Word Expected

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y. — (AP) — Authoritative sources said Wednesday Warren R. Austin probably would make a major pronouncement on U. S. atomic-arms policy when the United Nations Security Council resumes international disarmament discussions next week.

These sources said they expected the American representative to the United Nations to give a sharper definition of U. S. ideas on how the council should proceed with atomic control and disarmament.

Austin's talks with Secretary of state Marshall and President Truman in Washington were believed to be aimed at working out this definition so there could be no doubt as to where the United States stands on these issues.

American sources here said there would be no change in America's basic policy on atomic control and disarmament as far as they knew. They said the U. S. still was opposed to the proposal made by Russia to establish a disarmament commission until the procedure for handling the atomic question is settled.

The disarmament commission and the Atomic Energy Commission might work concurrently, they explained, if the atomic issue was not by-passed and made secondary in discussions.

Meanwhile, the Security Council was more or less stymied Wednesday by postponements.

The vital arms question cannot be tackled until next Monday, the date that the U. S. requested when it obtained postponement two weeks ago to give Austin and Marshall time to confer.

The council was still awaiting word from the Albanian government when its representative could be expected here to answer British charges of mine sowing in Corfu Channel.

A telegram was sent to the Tirana government Tuesday by the council after agreeing to further postponement of the case.

Navy Dive-Bomber Pilot Feared Lost

HONOLULU — (AP) — Air-sea rescue units searched Wednesday for a U. S. Navy dive-bomber which was reported to have crashed into the sea near the western tip of Molokai.

The airplane, which was from the aircraft carrier Tarawa, plunged into the water less than a mile off-shore Tuesday. Navy officials, withheld the name of the pilot who was believed to have perished in the crash.

Cable Cars Going Out

SAN FRANCISCO — (AP) — San Francisco plans to scrap its colorful, historic cable cars, the city-owned cable cars, in favor of twin-engine motor buses.

City officials announced that the cable cars must yield San Francisco's hills because they are too expensive to operate and they are dangerous.

Rails, a special kind which no longer are being manufactured, are worn dangerously thin and cables, hemp rope stranded with steel, are hard to get, officials said. Gripmen are aging and younger men just don't want to work on the tiny cars.

The famed Powell Street and the Washington-Jackson runs are operated by the municipal railway. Beginning next month, these cables won't run on Sundays when the buses are expected to arrive. Later the buses will be used in the evening.

Death Sentence Given Jap Colonel

MANILA — (AP) — After a three-months-trial in which the testimony filled 3500 pages, former Col. Masakazu Yamaguchi was convicted by a U. S. war crimes commission Wednesday, and sentenced to the gallows. He was accused of permitting atrocities on Filipino civilians and guerrillas during his term of command of Negros Island. The 61 prosecution witnesses testified as to mass murders and rapes between 1943 and 1945.

Scores Become III After Lodge Dinner

WENATCHEE — (AP) — An estimated 75 Wenatchee members of the Elks Lodge were stricken by food poisoning after a lodge dinner Tuesday night and two ambulances and scores of private cars were pressed into service rushing the extremely sick brothers to hospitals and private homes.

No deaths resulted and half the men who attended the dinner, eating the same food as the stricken victims, were unaffected.

All of the city's doctors were called into service to administer emetics and hypodermic injections. In the height of the excitement at midnight, Dr. A. G. Young, speeding to a local hospital was seriously injured when his car was struck by an ambulance hurrying back to the Elks headquarters for another load of victims.

Lumbering Seen An Alaskan Forte

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A commission of transportation experts Wednesday relegated fishing and mining to subsidiary roles in the development of Alaskan trade, naming the timber and tourist industries as the coming "big businesses" of the northern territory.

Three members of a technical commission named by the House Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee decided that the Alaskan fish catch probably has reached its peak and that mining "is on the downgrade."

"Timber and timber products represent a real potential for the future," the commission report said. "The tourist business could be developed to real proportions. This business should be developed because it means not only revenue to the carriers, but business for the territory as well."

The report was signed by F. A. Zeuser, retired Coast Guard admiral; Worth Fowler, Maritime Commission Alaskan specialist and Thomas Plant, vice president of the American-Hawaiian Steamship Co.

They said that labor difficulties within the transportation business, particularly in shipping, were the biggest handicaps to overall development of Alaskan industry and trade.
