

Hunter Warns YMCA Board Of Russian 'Imperial Ambition'

Although the United States turned back the worst onslaught of arms ever brought against civilized people in the recent war, the battle is not over yet for 14,000,000 veterans who have returned, Frederick M. Hunter, honorary chancellor of the State System of Higher Education told more than 100 persons attending the annual YMCA meeting Wednesday night.

"The new attack is one of materialism, a combination of dictatorship and ambition for imperialism on the part of our former ally, Soviet Russia," the speaker declared. He urged that the veterans who "have been on a Christian crusade with their lives on the altar" use patience and firmness, but emphasized that they must see that the "political chicanery" on the part of Russia must cease.

To meet this problem Dr. Hunter suggested that U. S. military power be kept at top strength so that when "peace is threatened, the U. S. military forces can be called upon by the international police to stop the trouble with force."

One World Seen

"The world is one world," Dr. Hunter continued, and leaders on fronts making new history have gripped that idea. The conception has not completely gripped America yet. He spoke of the YMCA as important in the development of "one world," and pointed out that another duty of the Christian veteran will be to see that the world is fed, and that the standard of living is raised.

"By winning the war, the Christian democracies have been given a chance to go forward they would not have had if the war had gone the other way," the speaker pointed out. "There is no

use looking back to days before the war and sighing for old times which will not come again. Never in the progress of America have we gone backward. Victory has opened a door, and we must go forward."

Way to Peace

The United States is looked upon as a nation which has half the world's wealth, and which will lead the way to a new peace, Dr. Hunter said.

The Christian veterans must have a sense of responsibility, and help shape the course of the nation, and if agencies are present to give them a chance to work they will go far, the former chancellor said. He declared that the YMCA, through its variety of character-building programs, can do more to help the cause than any other agency.

The veteran, Dr. Hunter concluded, must be assured of making a success of his career, must keep himself spiritually alive, must acquaint himself with problems of the nation and the world, and must meet Communism with Christianity, as true democracy in all communities is the product of

Christianity.

Prior to Dr. Hunter's talk, Edgar Martin announced the results of mail balloting on elections to the YMCA board. Elected were Henry Fehly, John Harpam, Clarence Hines, R. W. Kimberling, Roy Morse, Merle Nash, Nathan Rubenstein, and Virgil Cameron. Officers will be elected from the group at a meeting Feb. 4.

Reports were also given by R. W. Kimberling, treasurer, who pointed out that the YMCA had ended the past year with a surplus of \$127.73, and by Virgil Cameron on membership.

A transcription depicting growth and activities of the YMCA in Eugene was played by Don Hunter. Assisting in making the transcription were Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Nidever, William Lush, A. F. Holmer, Virgil Cameron, Paul Potter, Cecil Warner, Erwin Jullis, Herbert Armstrong, Bob Eubanks and Don Hunter.

Music was provided by the Eugene High School string orchestra, and Mr. and Mrs. Lowell Chase.

William Lush presided in the absence of President Walter Ransom, who has been ill.

Oregon Pine Waste Utilization Possible

CORVALLIS —(AP)—An excellent hardboard can be made from Ponderosa pine waste—but the bug is that you've got to make too much of it.

Oregon Forest Products laboratory, experimenting at the request of the Lakeview Chamber of Commerce, found that the waste from eastern Oregon's Ponderosa pine could be turned into hardboard efficiently with a plant producing 50 tons a day.

That, however, reported Paul M. Dunn, Oregon State College forestry dean and laboratory head, would require about 33 cords of slab wood daily and a million-dollar plant investment.

To make the waste utilization practical for a fairly large mill or group of smaller mills, a process that would be efficient on a smaller scale—say 20 tons daily—would require a capital outlay of \$250,000.

Laboratory officials held out hope of developing such a process if funds continue available.

Twenty-Ounce Baby Said 'Holding Own'

NEW YORK —(AP)—Patricia Ann Connolly, 20-ounce infant born three months premature to Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Connolly, was "holding her own" Thursday in a Kew Gardens Hospital incubator.

Hospital attendants said the baby's footprint was the same size as her mother's thumb print on the hospital record.
