Red Cross Gifts Acknowledged

Letters acknowledging receipt of Junior Red Cross gift boxes have begun to reach Eugene from the Philippine Islands, where many of the gift boxes were sent, the JRC has reported.

The letters were written by children in the first grade in several different schools in the islands. From Dugo School in Cebu City, one student wrote to Whiteaker School in Eugene: "We thank you very much for the gifts you sent us. Our parents were very happy with the gifts. They say that American children are very kind."

Another letter from Menganga, Camalanagan, Cagayan, to Mapleton Grade School, said: "Our school received a box of Red Cross gifts from your school. Our teacher distributed the gifts by lot. We hope to receive some more." The letter was signed by the first grade.

Members of the Lane County JRC have long had a project of packing gift boxes for children in other lands. The boxes are small, but hold a large number of items. Emphasis is given to inclusion of school and health supplies to help make up for the scarcity of such items in war-devastated areas.

Lane JRC members have filled 600 gift boxes to date, and have a goal of 1000 to fill by April 1.

Schools wishing to participate may contact the local Red Cross office, as the United States Office of Education has given formal recognition to the American Junior Red Cross as the best channel through which students can assist in educational rehabilitation abroad.
