MOSES WROTE:
"And all the people perceived the thunderings, and the lightnings, and the voice of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking: and when the people saw it, they trembled, and stood afar off. And they said unto Moses, Speak thou with us, but let not God speak with us, lest we die" (Exo. 20:18-19). We showed last time that the New Testament church did not keep the Sabbath Day of the Old Testament. Thus any church that keeps the Sabbath in this era is not the New Testament church.

This truth is not acceptable to some. They maintain that two laws are set forth in the Old Testament—the Ten Commandments (Law of God) and the law of sacrifice. The latter was removed by Christ, but the former remains. In an effort to sustain this idea it is said that the Ten Commandments were spoken by God while the other law was given by Moses. Notice the above quoted verses. God spoke the Ten Commandments. The people were afraid. They requested that Moses talk to them. No indication is given that God would not have given all the law just as He gave the Ten Commandments if the people would have desired it. They asked that Moses speak to them. Thus the remainder of the law was given through Moses, yet God gave it (Read Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers).

Actually, the Scriptures make no distinction between the Ten Commandments and the other Old Testament law. Ezra 7:8: "This is the law which Jehovah, the God of Israel had given." God gave the law in Moses. Read 2 Chron. 34:14. It is stated that Moses gave the law of Jehovah. Jesus indicated that the Ten Commandments were a part of the law of Moses when he said, "For Moses said, brother" (Mk. 7:10). The law of sacrifice is called "the law of the Lord" (Luke 2:24). Many other scriptures could be given in support of the truth that the word of God does not support the idea that the Old Testament was divided.
