

Greeley Sees More Tree Growth; Hits Revolt Against US Controls

PORTLAND — (AP) — The nation's lumber industry "may ultimately double our present national growth of saw timber" by perfecting and extending its best logging and wood-using methods, in the opinion of Col. W. B. Greeley of Seattle, veteran leader of the Pacific Northwest's lumber industry.

Greeley, vice president of the West Coast Lumbermen's Assn. and once chief of the U. S. Forest Service, told the Pacific logging congress Tuesday:

"That would give us 72,000,000,000 feet a year, beyond any scale of wood consumption this country has ever known."

Col. Greeley declared that "30 per cent of our forest land is still without organized protection and about one fifth of the annual forest growth goes up in smoke."

He observed that the "forest in-

Naval Air Reserve Unit Plans Made for Eugene

Plans for establishing auxiliary Naval Air Reserve training units in Eugene and Corvallis were announced in Eugene this week by Lt. Cmdr. Walter G. Lunsford, officer in charge of Naval Reserve recruiting in the 13th Naval District.

Cmdr. L. M. Melson, executive officer, Naval Reserve, Naval Air Station, Seattle, Wash., gave this information to Lt. Cmdr. Lunsford and said that a naval unit now is being formed in Portland under the command of Lt. Cmdr. C. C. Burke, 7445 S. E. 32nd Ave., Portland.

Army Discloses Training Plan

WASHINGTON—(AP)—War Department plans for a reduction of almost 200,000 in the size of the Regular Army and establishment of an "M-day" force of 1,750,000 trained troops were disclosed Wednesday by members of the House Armed Services Committee.

The plan depends on a universal training program to build up the national guard and the organized reserves, committee members said, so that within one year from "M-day" the force could be expanded to 5,500,000 men.

Just how quickly the reduction in the Regular Army will be effected, they said, depends largely on international developments. But they pointed out that President Truman's budget message to Congress contemplates maintaining a standing army of 1,070,000 during the year beginning July 1.

The entire mobilization-day setup, committee members said, is based on a three-point legislative program including universal training, merger of the armed forces, and coordinated scientific research and development.

Details were divulged following a meeting at the Pentagon Tuesday attended by most members of the committee, Secretary of War Patterson, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, and other top Army officials.
