

Homage Paid Two's Heroes

TWO JIMA—(AP)—A thousand American soldiers stood at attention before a sandy graveyard here Wednesday to pay homage to the 4000 marines who died two years ago to secure this strategic island for their country.

The troops now garrison the island and maintain the Army Air Force base, but the ceremony was in honor of the Marines who took the island from the Japanese. Three Marine divisions participated in the costly operation—in February of 1945. Its main objective was to obtain an air field close to Japan's home islands.

The cemetery lies at the foot of Mt. Suribachi, its rows of white crosses and stars of David in orderly rows across the volcanic sands where thousands fell before the concentrated mortar and machine-gun fire of Japanese gunners.

Nine B-29s, the huge bombers whose crews in later stages of the war often used Iwo's landing strip in emergencies when their fuel was running low or their engines were disabled, wheeled overhead as three service men laid wreaths at the base of the cemetery monument and an honor guard fired the traditional three-round salute.

Anti-Closed Shop Bills Make Headway

LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—(AP)—Anti-closed shop bills received legislative approval Tuesday in Arkansas, Tennessee and Georgia.

At Little Rock, the House passed 75 to 16 a Senate-approved measure making the 1944 anti-closed shop constitutional amendment operative. The bill would become effective when signed by Governor Ben Laney.

The Tennessee Senate, at Nashville, passed an anti-closed shop bill 16 to 7. The House still must act on the measure.

At Atlanta, the Georgia Senate besides voting a ban on the closed shop, unanimously approved bills forbidding involuntary checkoff of union dues and restricting picketing of strike-bound industrial plants. Companion measures in the House were placed at the top of the calendar despite an unfavorable committee report.

Work Begins on EFGA Concrete Warehouse

Stien Bros. Contractors of Eugene began work Wednesday on a one-story concrete block warehouse, 90 by 120 feet, for the Eugene Fruit Growers Assn.

Contract for the building, to be built on the EFGA plant grounds, was awarded last week to Stien Bros. The bid was \$27,000. The Eugene Concrete Pipe and Products Co. will furnish the blocks. Chester Hunter, local contractor, will lay them.

New York Markets

NEW YORK, Feb. 19—(UP)—Stocks broke 1 to 4 points on active trading today but turned down just before closing with some volatility.

Many leaders rallied from their lows of the day although buying was limited to turn the trend. News was mostly favorable and included a recommendation of 3 to 4 points for Johnson & Johnson, a 25-cent rise in the price of the company's common stock, and a 5-cent rise in operating revenues for class one railroads.

Earlier realizing and general inattention forced high-priced issues down 3 to 4 points. Leaders registered losses of 1 to more than 3 points in industrial and rail sections. Some utilities gained. Oil weakened.

American Woolen issues declined as much as 4 1/2 points in the preferred. American Chicle lost 4. Declines of 3 points or more were noted in Allied Chemical, Du Pont, United Pacific, U. S. Gypsum, American Power & Light, Inland, and Minnesota Mining.

Steel issues were mixed, with much as 1 1/2 in U. S. Steel and Youngstown Sheet & Tube and 1 1/2 in Bethlehem. These declines were partly due to a decline in Chrysler made up a good part of a loss of 1 1/2 in General Motors met support after a 1 1/2-point decline.

Santa Fe sold at 9 1/2, off 1/4. Southern Pacific 4 1/2 off 1/4; and Union Pacific 13 1/2 off 1/4. The latter was supported after selling at 20 off 1/4.

Johns-Manville ran up more than 3 points on its split announcement. Small gains came into Boeing Airplane, International Silver, Pepsi-Cola, Engineers Service, and Western Union.
