

# Russians Said Eyeing Account

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Russia after a year of enigmatic silence

finally has agreed to "look into" the question of squaring her \$11,298,000,000 lend-lease bill, it was learned Friday.

This first hint that the bill would get any study at all was received here following recent conferences in Moscow between U. S. Ambassador Walter Bedell Smith and Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov.

State Department and lend-lease officials emphasized, however, that there still was no assurance the Soviets were ready to sit down and square their account. The answers received by Smith were said to be brief and non-committal—simply to the effect that Russia "would look into the matter."

The United States, it was learned, has made a total of six attempts within the past year to get Russia to begin initial discussions looking toward a lend-lease settlement. Only Smith's personal conferences prompted a reply.

Great Britain, France, Belgium, Turkey, Australia, and New Zealand settled their lend-lease obligations more than six months ago.
