DETROIT — (AP) — The Detroit News Friday announced in a page one box that all display and classified advertising will be omitted from its edition next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday because of a newsprint shortage.

"The scarcity of railroad cars and the severe weather in areas where paper is produced," the News said, "have held up badly needed shipments. Thus the News' stock of newsprint available in Detroit has dwindled to dangerously low levels."

"There are prospects of improvement in the situation soon. We hope that we can resume normal publication of advertising on Thursday, Feb. 27."
