City to Do Repairs On Faulty Asphalt

The city maintenance department will repair several bad spots in Eugene streets until the J. C. Compton Co., Portland contractors, can return to repair asphaltic pavement which did not meet with the approval of city officials and citizens when it was laid last fall.
 City Manager Deane Seeger said the company has not been paid a cent for the job, which will run in excess of \$20,000. The failure of the company to do a satisfactory job was attributed to rainy and cold weather, and to inexperienced help at the plant. Seeger said engineers who have examined the work indicated that the mixture was overheated.
 A street department crew will repair the worst spots, in the next week or two, and the work will be charged to the contractors. Seeger said the company would do the job over when the weather is sufficiently warm this summer.
