

Manila Sees Fighting Traditional Feud

Three Manila men were wounded Friday in a gun fight with Philippine military police who, the police said, opened fire because they were being questioned in a battle in Quizon, Manila's eastern suburb.

Only the arrival of civilian police reinforcements stopped the fight. Manila residents recalled a two-day battle in 1920 between Manila police and the former Philippine Constabulary, which later became the Military Police Command. They said neither side had forgotten that affair.

Soong's Policy Under Attack

NANKING — (AP) — The Chinese government faced an internal conflict over its economic policies Friday after the legislative Yuan refused to provide penalties for violators of the emergency economic measures of the Supreme National Defense Council.

The yuan strongly criticized policies of Premier T. V. Soong, and it appeared that Soong would attend its next meeting on March 1 to answer questions.

In rejecting the council's request for penalties, the yuan resolved to send the council a counter-proposal that the economic measures be presented for examination by the yuan "since they have a great bearing on the people's burdens and freedom."

The yuan unexpectedly criticized the banning of gold transactions and circulation of U. S. dollars.

The ban on U. S. dollars was impractical, the yuan said, because of the impossibility of stamping out the black market.

One member said Soong was entirely to blame for the economic crisis because of the failure of his gold policy. Another member said it was foolish now to place the blame on the Japanese and the Communists.

A new world aviation code is being worked out by 40 nations in order to further greater flying safety.

Hirohito's Tax 90 Per Cent

TOKYO — (AP) — Emperor Hirohito will surrender 90 per cent of his wealth to the government as a special property tax, the imperial household department announced Friday.

Placing the emperor's total wealth at 3,710,716,338 yen—about \$250,000,000 (U. S.)—the department said property valued at 3,338,260,712 yen will be turned over to the government.

The emperor will retain possession of the inner palace, his present residence, as well as the Akasaka detached palace, Kyoto detached palace and three villas at Hayama, Numazu and Nasu.

Among the property which will be surrendered will be museums in Tokyo and Nara, land, buildings and forests of the emperor's forestry holdings, and a greater part of the imperial art objects.

Red Army Cut In '47 Budget

MOSCOW — (AP) — Delegates to the Supreme Soviet (parliament) debated Friday a 1947 budget calling for a decrease in expenditures for the Soviet armed forces and increases for industry, public health, sport, communications and agriculture.

Total income for 1947 was estimated in the budget at 391,500,000,000 rubles and expenditures at 371,400,000,000 rubles, of which 18 per cent would be assigned to the armed forces as against 24 per cent last year.

The budget, submitted to a joint session Thursday night by Finance Minister Arseni G. Zverev, would assign the armed forces 67,000,000,000 rubles this year, as against 72,600,000,000 in 1946.

(The ruble is not quoted in foreign exchange trade. The official exchange rate is 5.3 to the dollar. The diplomatic rate is 12 to the dollar. Russian government finances include many items which, in the United States, are handled by private capital. Russia's estimated expenditures would total about \$70,075,000,000 at the "official" rate; or \$30,980,000,000 at the "diplomatic" rate.)

(President Truman's budget for the fiscal year starting July 1, now under scrutiny in Congress, calls for appropriations of \$37,500,000,000. Of this about \$11,200,000,000, some 30 per cent, would go for defense.)

The budget recommendations expected to meet with general approval of the many hundreds of delegates from all over the U. S. S. R., conformed with the announced policy of Russia to put less emphasis on the army, navy and air force and accent the internal economy in connection with Prime Minister Stalin's five-year plans.

Salem Boy Blamed For Baby's Death

SALEM — (AP) — The four-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. A. Reynolds of the Salem farm labor camp died Thursday night from burns which Sheriff Denver Young said were received when a 6-year-old neighbor boy put her into a hot cook stove.

The baby's mother said she had gone to a neighbor's house and had left the baby lying on a bed. When she came back, the baby was in the stove, Sheriff Young quoted the woman as saying.

Young estimated the baby had been lying on the glowing coals for 10 minutes. The baby died five hours later.

Four Army Prisoners Overpower Guard, Flee

CAMP KILMER, N. J. — (AP) — Military and civil police broadcast an alarm Friday for four escaped Army prisoners who overpowered a work detail guard and seized his rifle.

The prisoners were working in an Army hospital car Thursday at about 5 p.m. when one seized the guard's rifle. While another held a mess kit knife at the guard's throat, he was tied and thrown on one of the beds in the car.

The guard later untied himself and reported the escape.
