OUR LORD SAID:

Wherein you find us to be in error, please inform us about it. Where you find us to be teaching the truth, you are duty bound before God to accept it. With your Bible in hand, your heart set on pleasing the Lord, and a complete freedom from prejudice, let us approach a study of what God wants you to do to be saved.

In the above quoted passage of Scripture we note that the gospel is connected with the plan to salvation. Jesus charged the apostles to "preach the gospel to the whole creation." But why preach it to all people? The answer to this question is given by Paul. "For I am not ashamed of the gospel: for it is the power of God unto salvation; to every one that believeth: to the Jew first, and also to the Greek" (Rom. 1:16). Without the gospel no one could be saved.
