

Village, Plagued by Curse Allowed Extra Bread Rations

LONDON—(UP)—The Food Ministry has granted Sir Anthony Doughty-Tichborne 14,000 bread units to hold off an 800 year old curse which requires his family to give flour to every resident of Alresford in Hampshire each March 25, it has been disclosed here.

The ministry at first refused the grant because of the exceptional shortage of bread, but relented.

In 1150 the then Lady Tichborne, bedridden for years, was dying. She wanted to give some land to the villagers. Her miser husband sneered that she could give them all she could move around. She crept out of bed and crawled around 23 acres, which

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Pauley Quits Reparation Job

WASHINGTON—(UP)—Edwin W. Pauley resigned Friday as United States reparations commissioner. He will continue to act as adviser on reparations matters to Secretary of State George C. Marshall.

Pauley's resignation was announced by the White House. It covers both his post as the President's personal representative on reparations matters and as U. S. representative on the Allied Commission on Reparations.

Pauley has worked on both German and Japanese reparations. President Truman, praising Pauley for his service in an important and difficult assignment, said he was accepting the resignation only because of Pauley's "generous offer" to act as adviser to Marshall on reparations matters.

Pauley said in his letter of resignation that he believed he, Mr. Truman and Marshall "are in agreement that the necessity for my reporting directly to you... no longer exists."

That's All, Thanks, 'Cus I'm Leaving Now

SAN DIEGO—(UP)—They can rest easily now. It's the third and last holdup for them by their recurrent bandit—the bandit said so.

"This is the last time; I'm leaving town."

With these words the young, armed bandit held up Jack Schwartz, manager of the Mission Liquor Store, and his son Bernard Schwartz, and escaped with \$204, police reported. The same gunman held up the liquor store Feb. 11, and fled with \$388, and on Feb. 1 robbed it for \$200.

State Police Arrest Sutherland Mill Worker

State police Thursday arrested Ewald Charles Schaetzke, 50, Sutherland mill worker, on charges of driving while drunk and hit and run. The alleged offenses occurred on Highway 89 while Schaetzke was driving north from Sutherland.

Two cars were assertedly side-swiped, one of which was driven by Rev. Haywood P. Sconce of Roseburg, state police said. The other driver's name was not available. Schaetzke was in the county jail Friday.

Freight Concern Gets Okay on Rate Change

McCracken Bros. Motor Freight of Eugene has obtained approval of the State Utilities Commission to calculate its rates on weight and bulk of goods transported, rather than on an hourly basis, it was disclosed Friday by the commission.

Approval was granted after a hearing March 4 in the City Hall here. Other carriers here asked for more time to study the change and are not affected by it. The change is effective for goods transported by McCracken Bros. within 40 miles of Eugene.

Metallurgist to Tell Of Alkali Production

Production of alkali metals will be discussed by Dr. W. J. Kroll, consulting metallurgist of the northwest electrodevelopment laboratory, U. S. Bureau of Mines, Albany, at a chemistry seminar in the University of Oregon March 11.

This seminar will be the last of the winter term. It is scheduled for 4 p.m. in 103 McClure Hall. Dr. Kroll's discussion will cover both chemical and electrochemical methods employed for potassium, lithium, rubidium, and cesium.

Two Eugene students, Doris Chessman and Ruth Wahlgren, have been elected to head the University of Oregon chapter of Alpha Kappa Delta, national sociology honorary.

Miss Chessman, a junior sociology major, replaces Norma Grandstrom, Portland, as president. Miss Wahlgren, senior sociology major, replaces Betty Frey, Medford, as secretary-treasurer.

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Recorder Sets Sewer Hearing

SPRINGFIELD—The public hearing on the proposed reassignment of property bordering the main trunk sewer and its laterals will be held Monday, March 17, at 7:30 p.m. in the city hall, according to cards mailed to property owners this week.

At the hearing property owners will be given the opportunity to express their opinions on the assessment, which has been based down in city council meetings from \$74,000 to a proposed \$45,550.

Hearing First
City Recorder K. R. Gile Friday emphasized that until after the hearing has been held there can be no assessment against the properties. In preparing the individual notices he listed the proposed levy against each piece of property—this figure is only a recommendation, he stressed.

Gile said many persons who had received the notices had attempted to pay their "sewer bill" on the basis of the figures quoted on their notices. He asserted that the money cannot be collected until after the hearing has been held, and an assessment ordinance passed by the council.

Gives Basis
The ordinance will be drawn on the results of the public hearing, the recorder said.

Gile reported the assessment was figured on a base of \$1.29 per assessable foot for persons owning property on one side of a sewer. He said this levy should return \$45,550 to the city for construction of future sewers.

VFW Granted Surplus Goods

SPRINGFIELD—The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3965 Friday was allotted war surplus sheets and pillow cases as a cooperative buying group, according to the War Assets Administration in Portland.

The WAA said approximately \$50,000 worth of unused surplus sheets and pillow cases are being sold to Oregon and southwestern Washington veterans' groups. The articles then are distributed to members. They are part of a supply turned over to WAA by the Maritime Commission.

The WAA reported that VFW Post 3965 had been allotted 896 sheets and 2300 pillow cases.

Less Serious
Miss Oviatt was less seriously injured with a lacerated ankle, severed tendons of the ankle, and lacerations of the lower face. Hellie well received a dislocated hip, multiple cuts and bruises, a crushed chest and broken ribs.

Robert Messer, driver of the Eugene car, suffered severe lacerations of the face and chin, possible fractured jaw, a broken left arm and concussion. Smith received multiple cuts and bruises on his head and body, an injured hand, a crushed chest and concussion.

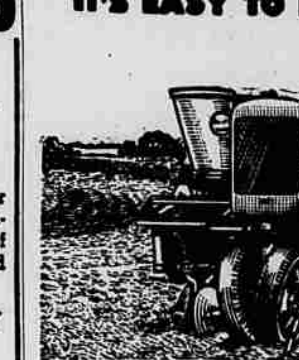
