COTTAGE GROVE — The most recent agreement between the city fathers of this community and directors of the new rural fire district is that there will be a three-year contract which certifies that the city of Cottage Grove will purchase one piece of new fire equipment, and will furnish one paid man, for approximately \$3500 paid as the tax money is assigned by the rural fire district.

This makes it possible for the district, newly created on the borders of the city, to have fire protection as soon as the new truck arrives, a speedier plan than for the directors of the rural area to wait for tax money to come in several months hence, and purchase equipment for themselves at that time.

Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Martin entertained for more than 40 March 1 in honor of the silver wedding of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Piper.

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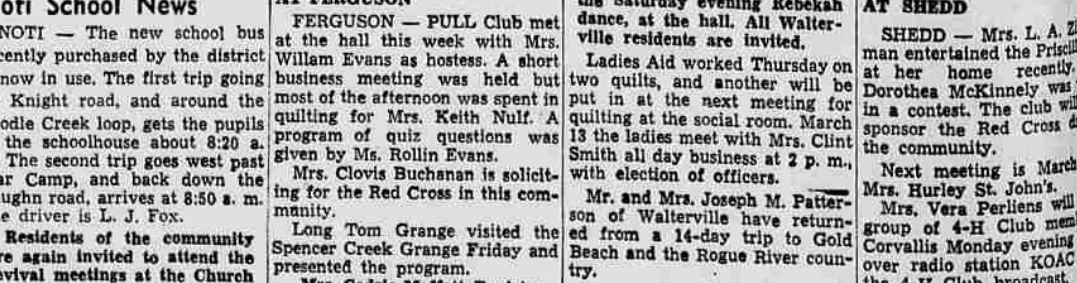
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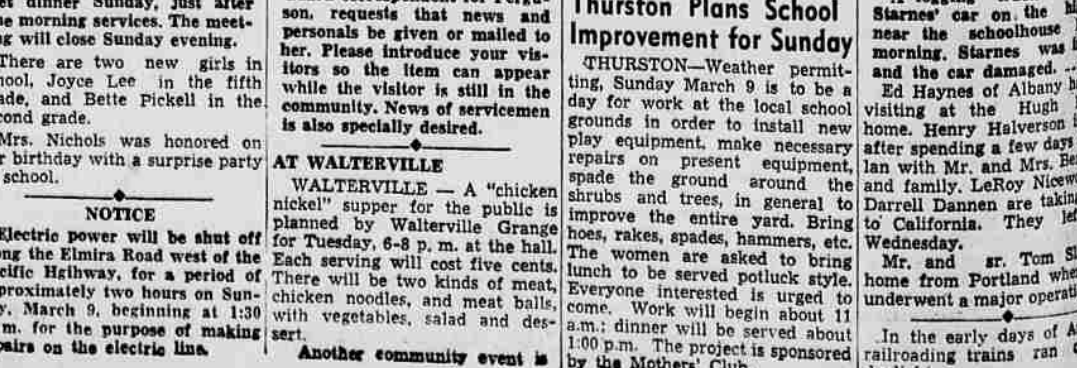
