

Bus Company Makes Changes Affecting Coburg, Springfield

Changes in city bus schedules which include initiation of a local service in Springfield and five additional daily round-trips to Coburg were announced Thursday by Thomas McLoughlin, local manager of Oregon Motor Stages. The changes become effective Sunday, March 16, and entail slight alterations in Eugene routes on Eighth Ave. W. and Eleventh Ave. W.

Shuttle Service
One bus will be operated separately in Springfield as part of a shuttle service east of the city. McLoughlin explained a recent

ruling by the Public Utilities Commission forced the discontinuance of through service from Eugene to the Jasper Road. The new service will operate on an hourly basis and will extend the line approximately 1 1/4 miles farther east than the present terminus at Jasper Rd. The bus will start from Fifth and Main in Springfield at approximately the same time as the previous Jasper Rd. route. Fare on the extension will be eight cents cash or one token and no transfers can be issued or accepted in conformance with the PUC ruling, McLoughlin said.

Alternate Trips
The shuttle service will operate on alternate trips as a local for the Nicholas Gardens area. It will start at Fifth and Main, go out Main and cover Garden Way, Morning Drive and Emory Lane in Nicholas Gardens, returning on Main to Fifth St. Passengers on this route may transfer to Eugene-bound buses.

Residents of Coburg will get additional service leaving there at 11:25 a.m., 12:25 p.m., 1:25 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. Buses for Coburg will leave Eighth and Willamette in Eugene at 10:55 a.m., 11:55 a.m., 12:55 p.m. and 2:05 p.m. A late bus will leave Eugene at 11:30 p.m. and arrive in Coburg at 11:55 p.m. for the benefit of theatergoers, McLoughlin said.

Slight Change
With the institution of these two additional services there will be a slight change in the operation of the Eleventh Ave. W. and Eighth Ave. W. lines in Eugene. The Eleventh Ave. bus now operates on alternate trips to the Air Park on Chambers St.

Effective Sunday the Eighth Ave. bus will go to the Air Park by way of Chambers St. on alternate trips. On the new route the bus will return on Chambers to Eleventh and then continue its regular run to Fifth and Willamette.

The Eleventh Ave. bus will operate over its regular route to Chambers, down Thirteenth to Polk and back on Polk to Eleventh on all trips.

Firemen Ask For Politeness

When the telephone rings at Eugene city fire department, all firemen jump into their turnouts and man the trucks.

But firemen complained Thursday that it was happening too often when there is no fire. They said too many people are calling the department's emergency number, 1000, to inquire about burning permits and other matters of a non-emergency nature.

What really scorchers them is being routed out of bed by a call on the emergency phone. The department's business phone is 920, listed in the directory under Fire Chief William Nussbaum's name. If the public will call 920 instead of 1000, it will save the firemen a lot of dressing and undressing.

OSES Asserts Prices Crippling

The Eugene office of Oregon State Employment Service charged in its monthly report Wednesday that the "high cost of building materials apparently has forced prospective home builders out of the market."

"Building materials are more plentiful, and home builders have failed to take advantage of good weather despite a critical housing shortage in the Eugene area," the report stated.

OSES said job opportunities were increasing Wednesday as more men went back to work in the mills and took spring cleaning jobs. There was no increased

activity in placement of women on jobs, and no decrease in the number of unemployed construction workers.

The unemployed at the end of February totaled an estimated 1600 in the Eugene area. This compares with 1850 unemployed at this time last year. During February 317 veterans were referred on jobs, with 201 finding placements. Some 375 veterans were referred on jobs in January, with 253 being placed.
