

Eugene Axemen Drop La Grande 44-30

Tigers' Jarrard Leads Scoring

The defending state champion Eugene High Axemen survived the first round of the state tournament Wednesday night by scoring a 44-30 victory over Coach Don Mabee's La Grande Tigers.

Left-handed Ernie Wilde was the big factor in the Axemen victory. He led the attack for Eugene with 12 points and played his always excellent floor game. Fred Jarrard of La Grande was high for the game, however, with 13 points.

The Axemen now go into the quarter-final round against the powerful Klamath Falls Pelicans. The clash will be the finale of Thursday night's quarter-final action.

La Grande's star guard, Bobby Green, sprained his ankle in a workout earlier in the week but he was one of the best guards in the tournament. He got eight points for the Tigers and showed plenty of speed and ball-handling ability despite his bad ankle.

Coach Hank Kuchera's Eugeneans jumped into an early lead after 45 seconds of play as Dick Garrett canned a field goal from the corner. The Tigers were never able to get out in front, although they threatened until the last few minutes.

Eugene was out in front, 14-5, at the end of the first quarter. The Tigers moved up to 12-16 and 14-18 during the second quarter but were trailing 14-20 at the half.

The teams battled on even terms in the third quarter. The Axemen were able to gain only one point and were out in front 33-26 at the end of the period.

Green plopped one in and then Jarrard and Bill Coleman both canned freethrows to bring the Tigers up to 33-30 as the fourth quarter opened. Wilde scored another one of his left-handers and then another from behind the backboard to put the Axemen seven points out in front at 37-30.

That just about ended the Tiger threat as Don Ruth and Dick Garrett scored to bring the Eugene total to 52. Green scored a freethrow for La Grande to make it 42-31.

Jarrard and Shoemaker scored a field goal and freethrow, respectively, for La Grande and Wilde scored again for Eugene to complete the scoring in the final minutes of play.

La Grande goes into consolation play for fifth place and met the amazing sophomore Lebanon team Thursday afternoon.
