

Two Men Killed In Plane Crash

WILBUR, Wash.—(AP)—A light plane, going into a spin at 200 feet, carried two men to their deaths when it crashed on a farm two

miles from the Wilbur airport. The victims were Lewis Hinger, 45, Mallott, Wash., garage man and pilot of the plane, and Joe Snider, Wenatchee, about 50, a passenger. Authorities said the plane crashed on the V. E. Jurgensen farm where only last Sunday Hinger had made a forced landing.

Knights' Portrayals of Educational Movies Rouses Interest in Audio-Visual Technique

Audio-visual education (via motion picture) is the coming thing, the Knights of the Round Table learned Tuesday night from Sir Lester Beck, University of Oregon psychologist, who spent the war years in Washington assisting the Army and Navy in developing their program.

But Sir Lester puts some big "ifs" in the path of the future, despite the fact that the National Educational Assn. two years ago appointed a full time director to supervise developments in this field (not from free will but per force).

These biggest "ifs" according to Knight Beck are:
Who will control educational films (and the big Hollywood

outlets are closing in)?
Who will edit educational movie materials?
What will the prices be for ordinary school use?

What effect will television have on the development and use of educational movies?

Before the war there were only a dozen producers of educational film, and the market for projection outfits was estimated at 20,000. Today there are 80 concerns; the market is estimated at 100,000 units with a possible 500,000 if every classroom is equipped, in which case educational film would dwarf commercial business.

Requires Skill
But—the educational film is entirely different from the ordinary entertainment film of commerce, and requires skilled people to make it and skilled people to use it for best results. He darkened the room and gave the knights a couple of samples.

First he showed a film which captures the growth of flowering of plants, an entrancing thing in what Hollywood would call "gorgeous technicolor" but without any very skillful "sound track" to tell the listeners what it is really all about (a vital factor if educational film is to teach).

Shows War Film
Then he showed a portion of one of the best educational films prepared by the Armed Forces during the war, entitled "War Comes to America," designed to explain to rookies why they had been called upon to leave their school books and their farms and workshops to fight.

It is a skillful piecing together with supplementary scenes enacted. It begins in the mid-thirties with Hitler and Mussolini and the Jap warlords in their heyday, step by step enslaving the little people of Europe, plotting the domination of the entire world.

Leaders Portrayed
It shows the American people ignorant and apathetic unaware of sections from actual newsreels their danger, resisting every effort to bring this nation to take a stand against aggression.

This is done by showing excerpts from Gallup polls of the time; showing Congressional leaders and others preaching isolationism, Roosevelt, Willkie and other leaders gradually shaping a program of defense.

Clamor For More
Sir Lester cut the film at the downfall of France, but the

Knights all clamored for more, so he went on to the "day of infamy" at Pearl Harbor. The film shows American people going peacefully about their business on that eventful Sunday, the Japanese special ambassadors calling on Secretary Hull with their treacherous talk of "peace" and (from captured Jap films) the actual takeoffs of the bombers which wrecked the American fleet.

The discourse left the Knights in a thoughtful and questioning mood.

Why doesn't the government continue the development of educational film for the problems of peace as well as war?

It has been tried but in one case the effort was stopped (in the case of dust bowl pictures) because Congressmen objected.

Why not educational movies for Congressmen?

There aren't any.

Why not an educational film on TVA?

There is a very good one.

Why don't commercial houses show educational films?

Don't know. Outside of "March of Time," which hardly fits the definition, there is very little of educational character in movie houses.

Wouldn't it be better to take the editing and preparation out of political management and put it under some of the large foundations which could maintain an objective attitude?

There are some efforts in that direction.

And so on. The Knights voted to move Ladies Night from May 6 to May 18 (the regular second Tuesday) and the place for this affair will be the Osburn. They transacted routine of membership and committee problems but the session was the longest of the current season because of the intense interest raised by Sir Lester's pictures and discussion.

Teach Anything
With skillfully made educational film, he said, it is possible to teach almost anything. If the teachers also are prepared to make wise use of this aid.

Particularly in the difficult field of current history and social problems, the pictures can make the situations real to students down to the lowest levels. But how to develop an education film service which is adequate, trustworthy, prompt and economical poses many difficulties.

American Author, Churchill Dies

WINTER PARK, Fla.—(AP)—Winston Churchill, the American author, died at the Research Studio here Wednesday of a heart attack. The 75-year-old author of "The Crisis" had come here several weeks ago to begin work on a new book. He was a regular winter guest at the Research Studio, haven for many noted authors and artists, for several years.

Friends said Churchill seemed to be in good health and was in high spirits up till the time of the sudden attack.

His body was removed to a local funeral home pending funeral arrangements by his two sons, Creighton, of Windsor, Vt., and John, of Washington, D.C.

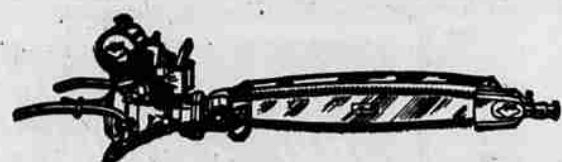

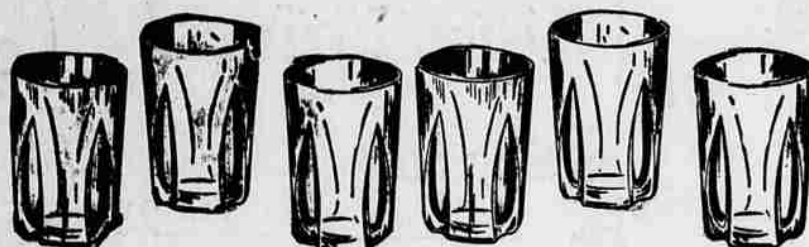

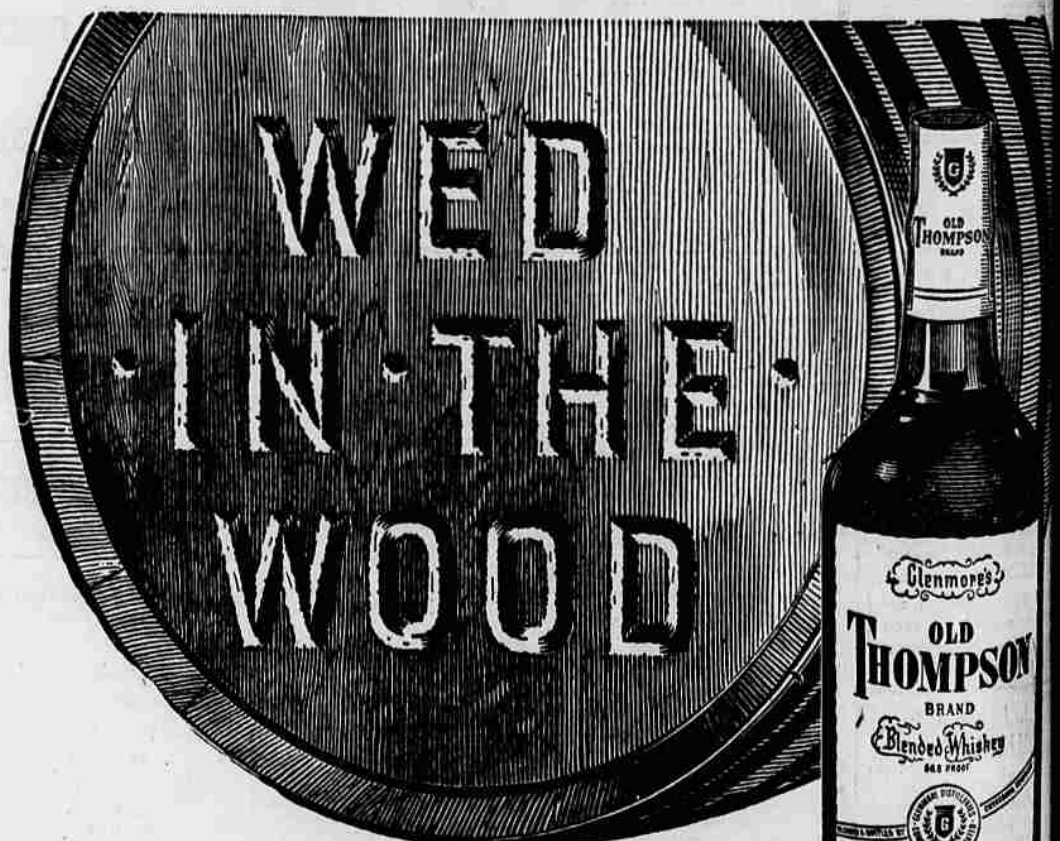
