## TNT to Give 'Big Blowout'

The Willamette National Forest  
 is really planning a "big blowout"  
 with the 20 tons of TNT they are  
 scheduled to receive through the  
 War Assets Administration, ac-  
 cording to Clyde Quam, adminis-  
 trative assistant in the Eugene of-  
 fice.  
 The TNT is part of 100 tons  
 which once was destined for Pa-  
 cific battle areas, and which now  
 will be used by Oregon's forest  
 services in the blazing of timber  
 access roads and trails. This use  
 constitutes the only terms for  
 transfer of the surplus explosives to  
 the forestry service.
