

# Reclamation Organization Heads Argue Payments on Power Dams

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Three more spokesmen for the National Reclamation Assn. testify Friday in favor of a controversial measure which both pro and con witnesses agree would result in an increase in public power rates in the West.

They are Don McBride, secretary-manager of the association, Floyd Hagis, who formerly held the position and is now with the Seattle Chamber of Commerce, and J. H. Moer, director and member of an association study group.

The bill by Rep. Robert Rockwell (R-Colo.) is one of several before a House Public Lands Subcommittee to alter reclamation laws. Major witnesses against it were Reclamation Commissioner Michael Straus and his assistant, William E. Warne.

Sawyer and other witnesses admitted under questioning that the effect of the bill would be to raise public power rates on such areas as the Columbia Valley of the Pacific Northwest and the Central Valley of California. It would, they say, reverse an opinion by a former Interior Department solicitor that public power rates need not repay enough money to cover the basic power investment. Such rates now return enough to pay three per cent interest on that investment, operation and maintenance on projects and contribute to irrigation

costs too high to be borne by water users. The Reclamation Assn. president said his group supported the bill because power should make immediate repayments on principal and because interest earned should not be diverted to pay irrigation costs. "But we do not support it because it would raise power rates," Sawyer said. Interior Department spokesmen claim that raising power rates would amount "to killing the goose that lays the golden egg for irrigation."

## Easter Sales Effect Shown

NEW YORK—(AP)—Easter buying boosted retail sales in the week ended Wednesday well above the preceding week and 9 to 13 per cent over the corresponding week a year ago, Dun & Bradstreet reported Friday.

"Shipments improved and most retailers were reported as being well stocked," the business research firm said. "Shoppers continued to display resistance to high prices and inferior quality." Interest in women's spring apparel increased noticeably with medium-priced suits and blouses in heavy demand. Some shoppers were attracted by clearance sales of winter clothing. Requests for children's and infants' wear increased.

## Naval Reserve Set to Organize

The group will apply to the 13th Naval District for designation as a volunteer unit for drill-pay status. If successful the program may result in the establishment of a training squadron in planes stationed locally for training purposes.

R. E. Kerr was appointed temporary commanding officer of the unit and will call for a second organizational meeting.

The proposed air component of the volunteer Naval Reserve comes

under the general Navy drive to enable experts on inactive duty to retain a working knowledge of skills learned in the service. In addition to the aviation section, the unit intends to establish electronics and general divisions. Named to a committee to nominate officers and plan further organization were Commander Roy R. Nelson; Lt. Cmdrs. Earl Boushey, Hugh Wood, A. A. Haberly and Paul Washke; Lt. Leon Glasscock and Lt. R. A. Kerr, and Lt. (jg) Don Brooks and Lt. (jg) George McCracken.

The nominating committee will meet Sunday night at Wood's home on Blanton Road.
