LUKE WROTE:

"Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and the rest of the apostles, Brethren, what shall we do? And Peter said unto them, Repent ye, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ unto the remission of your sins; and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For to you is the promise, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call unto him" (Acts 2:37-39). The plan of salvation of the New Testament church is well illustrated in the cases of conversion that are given in the Book of Acts. According to Acts 2 a great multitude of Jews from every nation under heaven were gathered in Jerusalem. They came together when they heard the commotion connected with the coming of the Holy Spirit in baptismal measure upon the apostles (V. 6). Then the apostle Peter arose with the eleven, explained what the baptism of the Spirit was. The Spirit came in fulfillment of Joel 2:28-30 according to Peter. Then Peter introduced Christ as Lord by showing the Jews that they had seen him crucified, knew of his resurrection, and that the coming of the Holy Spirit was a manifestation of Christ's exaltation. As a result of Peter's sermon, the question and answer quoted above were given. Verse 41 tells us that those who "received his word were baptized." Verse 47 indicates these were added to the New Testament church.

This account shows exactly what people did in New Testament times when they became Christians according to the plan of salvation. Note that Peter informed those people that the "promise is to you, to your children, and to all that are afar off." In Ephesians 2:17 Paul identifies those who are afar off as being the Gentiles. We conclude that the same plan applies to us. If not, why wouldn't it? No scriptural reason can be given.
