

Leighton to Open Lecture Series On Family, P-TA Relationships

Dr. Ralph W. Leighton, dean of the University of Oregon school of physical education, will open a university's special one-week course on problems in family life education and Parent-Teacher organization at 4:30 p.m. Monday in Room 130, the university library.

Also scheduled to take part in the opening session are Mrs. George Moorhead, associate professor of physical education in the university and field secretary for the university's E. C. Brown Trust, and Mrs. Harry George, president of the Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers.

Six-Day Course
The six-day course is being given cooperatively by the university's school of health and physical education, the National P-TA, the Oregon P-TA, the E. C. Brown Trust division of social hygiene education, University of Oregon Medical School, and the general extension division of the State System of Higher Education.

The opening address at the Monday dinner session will be delivered by Dr. James R. Jewell, dean of the school of education. He will talk on "Home and School Cooperation in Oregon". The Monday evening session will be conducted by Miss Mildred Wharton, extension specialist, National P-TA. She will lecture on "Case

for Home and School Cooperation."

Other Lectures
Other lectures will include: "Present Status of Family Education in America," by Mrs. Moorhead; "What the National Congress of Parents and Teachers Is and How It Operates," by Miss Wharton and Mrs. William Kleizer, past president of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers; "Family Life Education in Oregon High Schools," and a discussion of Oregon's program by Mrs. Moorhead; "What the National Congress of Parents and Teachers Does on a National, State, and Local Level," by Miss Wharton;

"Contribution of the Local P-TA to Better Homes, Schools and Community," by Dr. John Carroll, superintendent of San Diego county schools, Calif., representing the National Congress of Parents and Teachers; "Demonstration of Methods and Materials on Family Life Education," by Dr. H. S. Hoyman, associate professor of physical education in the university.

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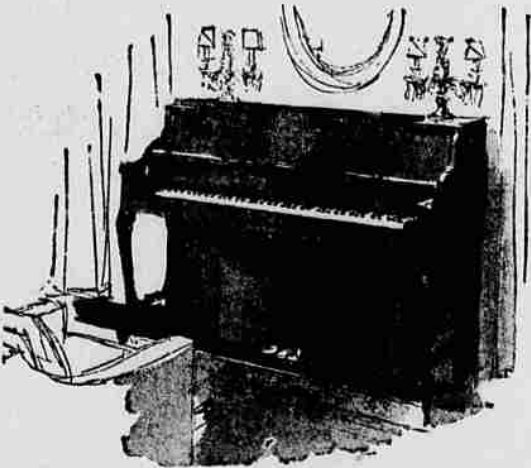
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Cities Ponder Rules For Standard Curbs

Increasing numbers of requests for service driveways in city business areas are making it necessary for a number of Oregon cities to consider adoption of standard regulations for curb and driveway control, according to the University of Oregon bureau of municipal research and service.

Curb parking space, already limited, is being greatly reduced by installation of service driveways, the report from the bureau states. Safety-conscious cities are also concerned with the hazards to pedestrians resulting from driveways which cross sidewalks.

service driveways. The bulletin includes sample city ordinances, a tabulation of administrative provisions for curb cut regulations in Oregon cities, diagrams of specification requirements, and other pertinent information.

The bulletin, first issued in 1939, has been sent to all city engineers in the state and is available to any city official on request.

Hoess Goes Back-- To Hang for Deaths

WARSAW—(AP)—Rudolf Hoess, convicted of killing 4,000,000 prisoners while he was German commandant at Oswiecim concentration camp, went back to Oswiecim Saturday—to be hanged.

The 47-year-old ex-colonel was convicted of the mass murders at Oswiecim (Auschwitz) by the nine-judge Polish supreme national tribunal April 2 after the prosecution had charged him with

responsibility for 4,000,000 murders by gassing. Hoess disputed only 2,500,000.

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
