

VLT Reveals Big Profits, Sets New Show 'Candida'

Eugene's Very Little Theater made a net profit of \$2900 from its recent production, "Streets of New York," the biggest money-maker and the longest-running show in VLT history.

Profits from "Streets of New York" gave the theater a total of \$8000 in its building fund, which it hopes eventually to swell to \$30,000. With the money, it plans a fireproof cement structure, for which plans are already drawn.

The local theater's most successful production, at least from the standpoint of profits, opened March 14 and closed April 3. The house was packed nightly, and the show resulted in at least two contributions from persons who saw it. A \$25 contribution came from a prominent citizen who saw the show twice.

A five-dollar donation was made by a heavy-set man who gave it on condition that the new theater be equipped with wider seats.

All Plays Profit

The Very Little Theater has never had a patron list, and has never asked for donations of any type. Since it was created in 1928, every show, however, has shown a profit of some sort.

Money earned from plays has been spent on electrical equipment, costumes and stage props, giving the theater an estimated \$10,000 worth of equipment at the present time. Ticket sales from "Streets of New York" totaled almost \$4000. Of this nearly \$700 was turned over to the federal government in amusement taxes, and production costs were \$400.

VLT also has announced plans for its next production, "Candida," tentatively scheduled to open in mid-May. Marvin Krenk will direct, and the two leading parts will be played by Horace Robinson, professor of drama at the University of Oregon, and by Mrs. Clare Hamlin, long associated with VLT.

Tickets Ready For UO Play At Mac Court

Tickets were on sale at the University of Oregon Saturday for the one-night performance of Marc Connelly's "The Green Pastures." The play will be directed by Horace W. Robinson and will be presented at MacArthur Court Saturday, April 19 at 8:15 p.m. It will feature the Eugene High School A Cappella Choir and will include a cast of about 100 students.

Russian Students Suspect US News

MOSCOW—(U.P.)—Russian college students—at least 100 of them at Moscow University—believe American newspapers are directed by anti-Soviet publishers who keep their correspondents in a form of slavery and force them to distort news.

American newsmen learned this during an impromptu open forum at the university. They learned also that Russian students are concerned about the new American policy in Greece and Turkey and the attitude of the Truman administration toward Communists and pro-Soviets in the government.

One of the American correspondents asked the students whether they were familiar with "The Russian Question," a new play which criticizes American newspapers and the way they are operated. The play pictures American newsmen as mere lack-

neys who obey the orders of anti-Russian publishers and angle their dispatches accordingly.

All the students were familiar with the play. Did they think it gave a true picture? All of them grinned and nodded their heads affirmatively. Even after meeting American correspondents as they had today? More nods.
