Black Market Costly to US

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Losses to the United States government through money operations connected with GI black marketing overseas may exceed \$500,000,000, a government official estimated Monday. He emphasized that this is an estimate and referred reporters to the war department. There the officially stated answer said only:

"Some United States military and civilian personnel overseas did participate in certain extra legal sales in Germany of personal, governmental or other dollar-acquired supplies during and after the war. These are commonly referred to as black market transactions.

"Today, the U. S. Army has a 'long' position in German marks which under present policy it is disposing of by normal processes. The present holdings do not, however, exceed future contemplated expenditures. A complete report on the acquisition and disposal of these holdings is presently being prepared for the information of the appropriate committees of Congress."

Daughter of Pioneers Dies After Sickness

Margaret M. Allen, 67, resident of Eugene for 38 years and the daughter of pioneer parents, died at her home, 1529 Willamette St., Sunday following a lingering illness.

Born Aug. 9, 1879, at Woodburn, she was the youngest of 13 children born to James and Ellen Casey. Her parents were natives of Ireland and Oregon pioneers. Her father came to the United States in 1846 and to Oregon in 1851, settling in Oregon City where he worked for Dr. McLaughlin. Her mother (Ellen Fagan) arrived in the United States in 1851 and in Oregon in 1853. They were married at Oregon City by Bishop Blavet May 19, 1853, and home-steaded northwest of Woodburn where their family was raised.

Margaret Casey was married May 19, 1913 at Eugene to Charles N. Allen, and was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church and the Altar Society. She had lived in Eugene since 1911.
