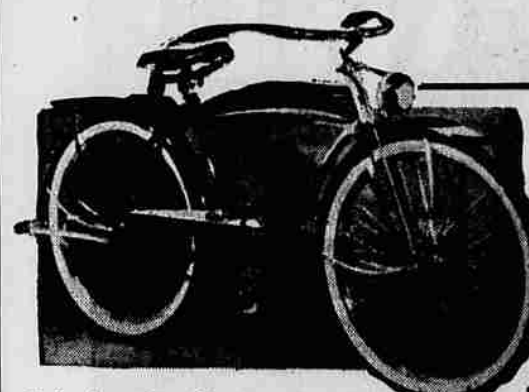
TUNA FLEET GOES MODERN

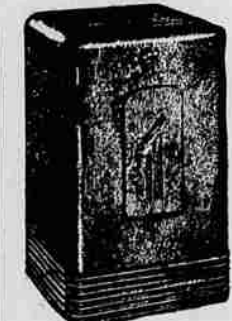

Lane's Power Fee Unchanged

Mountain States Power Co. will reduce its electric rates by about seven per cent for its 9000 Coos County customers on June 1, but no reduction in Lane County or other county rates is planned for the near future.

An Associated Press story quoted Public Utilities Commissioner George H. Flagg, Salem, as saying that the commercial rates in Coos County will be cut \$45,841 a year, with residential rates to be reduced \$25,516 a year.

L. W. Edwards, assistant division manager of Mt. States at Albany, said he could make no statement on plans for other counties, but pointed out that the "situation in Coos County is entirely different from that of other counties served by Mt. States."

Edwards said the rates in Lane County, for instance, have always been considerably lower than those of Coos County, but could not say whether or not the new reductions in Coos County would bring rates there lower than existing rates in Lane County.
