Magnesium Test Plant May Move to Albany

PULLMAN (AP)—Henry A. Doerner, supervisor of the Bureau of Mines pilot plant at Washington State College, said Tuesday he believed the process tested at the plant for using northwest magnesite to make magnesium is ready for large scale application.
 The plant is now operating on a 30-day test run.
 Doerner said a larger plant would automatically work out a number of the "bugs" now found in operating the small plant.
 The engineer in charge added that if projected Bureau of Mines budget cuts materialize, the equipment of the pilot plant will probably be moved to Albany, Ore., after the present test run ends some time in June.
