

Swim Project Work to Begin

City officials said Wednesday they hope to have excavation started by July 1 for the proposed new municipal swimming pool on the fairgrounds site.

Meantime, they are attempting to place orders for 30 tons of reinforcing steel and for items

which must be obtained before pouring of concrete. Employees of Beebe Construction Co. reportedly were at Camp Parks, Calif., Wednesday, where they are preparing to dismantle the pool purchased by the city from the Navy.

It is hoped the pool will be dismantled and ready for shipment to Eugene by mid-June. City Manager Denne Seeger said if all outside work can be completed this summer, installation of equipment inside the buildings can continue during winter months, thus having the pool ready by swimming season next spring.

Moriarty Resigns from Position As Lane Veteran Service Officer

Mike Moriarty has tendered to the county court his resignation as Lane County veterans' service officer, effective June 1, it was disclosed Wednesday by County Judge Clinton Hurd. The court so far has not acted in the matter.

For some time Moriarty has been acting as service officer and as veterans employment officer with the Oregon State Employment Service here. The volume of work has become too large to continue handling both jobs, Moriarty said when interviewed, and he will continue only as veterans employment officer with the OSES.

Act on Budget
The county court and budget committee are expected to act soon on the amount to be budgeted to provide a county service officer.

Meanwhile it was announced by George E. Sandy, director of the Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs at Salem, that the department now has three field representatives to assist county service officers and service officers of veterans' organizations, one of whom will have headquarters in Eugene.

Dover to Come
Floyd Dover, formerly of Grants Pass, will fill the post here, his territory including southern Oregon, from Eugene on the north and from Klamath Falls on the east.

Henry George, former employe of the War Assets Administration, will cover northwestern Oregon. Joe Reynolds will continue to handle the area, from Portland east to Idaho and south to Deschutes County.

UN Seen 'Failure' By Owen Roberts

HARTFORD, Conn.—(U.P.)—The United Nations was seen as a failure Wednesday by former Supreme Court Justice Owen J. Roberts who suggested that it be augmented by a federation of "like-minded" democratic nations.

Roberts claimed in a speech here that the UN "has failed to function in every important aspect in which it was called to act" because it recognizes national sovereignty. The only way to create international law, he said, is for nations voluntarily to surrender sovereign rights, as was done when the United States and the Swiss federation were formed.
