Sign Change Said Task Of State Men

City police explained Thursday that all one-way signs on highways through Eugene are the property of the state highway department and not in the jurisdiction of city officials, after a Register-Guard reader asked for larger and more readable signs.

The newspaper subscriber suggested a larger one-way sign at Sixth Ave. and Blair Blvd., where she said an elderly man was almost struck down by a car being driven the wrong direction on the one-way street.

"Police Chief L. L. Pittenger said, 'All one-way street signs are uniform signs placed by the state highway department, and we have no authority to change or enlarge them.'"

Wallace Hits 'Moves to War'

DENVER — U.P. — Henry A. Wallace Wednesday night accused the U. S. government of egging Europe into a war against Russia "without the slightest intention of defending Europe if war comes."

Continuing his cross-country speech-making campaign against the Truman Doctrine, the former vice president told a rally that "widespread armament" would lead to depression and war.

"Barring an accident, I don't expect war with Russia during the next year," he said. "We have a year or two in which to make irrevocable decisions."

Wallace charged that the Truman plan to give aid to Greece and Turkey was "irresponsible." Backers of the plan have "never stopped to think what it will cost," he said.

He said the Truman Doctrine would encourage "peoples of Europe to join an anti-Soviet armed camp in preparation for another war."

He scored the Republican Congress for cutting funds for farm programs and western development projects.

High School Levy Vote Due Monday

The \$10 per census child formerly levied by the county, there will be an offset of about 4 mills, which will be levied but not collected. The park district rate has not been set yet. It was about 5 mills this year.

Total of the general fund for next year has been set at \$186,065. This provides operating money. The bond interest and sinking fund will require \$8350 and the special improvement fund levy, \$12,000. These make a total budget of \$206,415.

Of this total the taxpayers are asked to provide, inside and outside the 6 per cent limit, \$125,212, including the \$8350 bond fund and \$12,000 improvement fund.

Income from the state and other sources is estimated at \$84,202. This, after allowing for \$3000 estimated delinquent taxes, would balance the budget at \$206,415.

Next year's general fund of \$186,065 compares with this year's budget figure of \$112,715.

Glenwood Tax Rate Close to Cities'

Glenwood property owners pay almost as much taxes as those of Springfield and Eugene, a survey showed Wednesday. The combined city, county, school and park district rates in Springfield total 76 mills. Combined city, county and school rates in Eugene also total 76 mills. In Glenwood the combined school, water district, county and park rates come to 73.7 mills.

Airplane Tour To Visit City

Four flights of private planes participating in a tri-state air tour sponsored by the Portland Chamber of Commerce are scheduled to end their flight in Eugene Friday noon, June 27, the Associated Press said Thursday.

The group of 80 planes will leave four airports in the Portland area Tuesday, June 24, going to Yakima for lunch, and to Walla Walla for the first overnight stop. Wednesday pilots will breakfast in Pendleton, then split the flights, with two visiting La Grande and two Baker. That night will be spent in Boise.

The groups will split for the final day, slower craft refueling at Lakeview, and all visiting Bend for lunch. Stops at Klamath Falls and Medford are planned for Thursday night.

The city tax rates which Springfield and Eugene pay help to provide for such services as police, fire protection, street maintenance, sewer maintenance, operation of city government, library and engineering.

Has Contract

Glenwood has a contract with Springfield for fire protection.

Most of its streets have not been improved to county standards and have not been accepted by the county, so that the county does not maintain and repair them.

Neither the county nor the cities maintain streets or roads which have not been brought up to standard. This cost falls on the property owners. After they have paid to bring their streets up to standard and they have been accepted by the city or county, then

they are maintained and repaired by the city or county.

Trunk sewers are built by city bond issues or general tax levies but laterals are paid for by property owners served by them. Both are maintained by the cities after they are installed.

Police protection in unincorporated areas is a county function but the county's budget is not large enough to provide much service in fringe areas of the type that cities supply within their own borders.
